## HOBART MAIL SIGNALS.

THE following Signals are hoisted at the Battery Point Signal Station to denote the arrival of the English and Foreign Mails by P. and O. Steamer:—At Albany, a red flag with white cross; at Adelaide, a blue and white chequered flag; at Melbourne, a blue flag; at Low Head, a white flag with blue cross; at Hobart, a white flag with red cross. The same flags, with the addition of a red pennant, signify that the Mail is by one of the Orient Co.'s Steamers.

A blue pennant at mast-head signifies that a delivery will take place at the General Post Office the same evening after arrival of the Express Train at 8.57 p.m.

When a Steamer from Melbourne is signalled off Low Head a red pennant is hoisted at the yard-arm on the left (as viewed from town) for two hours; a white pennant if the Steamer is from Sydney; and a pennant with red and white vertical stripes if from Adelaide. The following signals are hoisted at the General Post Office:—A red flag upon arrival of English and Intercolonial Mails; a blue flag upon arrival of Intercolonial Mails. These signals are lowered when mails are ready for delivery.

## LAUNCESTON MAIL SIGNALS.

When the P. and O. Steamer arrives at Albany a white pennant with a red ball is hoisted; at Adelaide the same pennant is hoisted above a blue, yellow, and red flag; and at Melbourne the same pennant above a white flag with a red cross. When a Steamer with English Mail is signalled off Low Head the above mentioned pennant is hoisted over a red flag; a red pennant hoisted in lieu of the white pennant signifies the Mail is by the Orient Line. Upon arrival of the Mails at the Post Office a blue and white chequered flag is hoisted.

PARCELS POST—See British and Foreign Parcels Post Regulations.

(a) COMMERCIAL PAPERS, under which are comprised all papers or documents written or drawn wholly or partly by hand (except letters or communications in the nature of letters, or other papers or documents having the character of an actual and personal correspondence), documents of legal procedure, deeds drawn up by public functionaries, copies of or extracts from deeds under private seal (and whether written or printed on stamped or unstamped paper), way-bills, bills of lading, invoices, and other documents of a mercantile character, documents of insurance and other public companies, all kinds of manuscript music, the manuscript of books and other literary works, and other papers of a similar description.

(b) PRINTED PAPERS, including periodical works, books (stitched or bound), pamphlets, sheets of music (printed), visiting cards, address cards, proofs of printing (with or without the manuscript relating thereto), engravings, photographs, pictures, drawings, papers impressed

† The following articles are prohibited from being sent as Samples through the Post to the United Kingdom:—Cocoa, Coffee, Chicory, Figs, Prunes, Raisins, Apricots, Tea, Tobacco, Manufactured and Unmanufactured Cigars, Cigarettes, Hydrate of Chloral, Soap (perfumed), and Playing Cards.

for the use of the blind, or cardboard drawing models stamped in relief (except for Russia and Sweden), plans, maps, catalogues, prospectuses, announcements, and notices of various kinds, whether printed, engraved, lithographed, or autographed, and in general all impressions or copies obtained upon paper, parchment, or cardboard by means of printing, lithography, autography, or any other mechanical process easy to recognise, except the copying-press and the type-writer, and anything usually attached or appurtenant to any of the before-mentioned articles in the way of binding, mounting, or otherwise, and anything convenient for their safe transmission by post which shall be contained in the same packet; also, printed, engraved, or lithographed circulars, notwithstanding that such circulars may be letters or communications in the nature of a letter. Stamps for prepayment, whether obliterated or not, and all printed articles constituting the sign of a monetary value, are, however, excluded from transmission by Book Post to countries of the Postal Union.

**DIMENSIONS.**—The limit of size for packets of Commercial Papers or Printed Papers are 18 inches in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight is 5 lbs. If there be any mixture of the two classes in the same packet, the whole packet is treated as Commercial Papers.

(c) **PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.**—The Pattern and Sample Post to Foreign Countries is restricted to *bona fide* trade patterns or samples of merchandise. Packets containing goods for sale, or in execution of an order (however small the quantity), or any articles from one private individual to another which are not actually patterns or samples, cannot be forwarded by Pattern Post.

No article liable to Customs Duties can be sent as a sample or pattern.

#### *Soldiers' and Sailors' Letters.*

Letters to or from non-commissioned officers, private soldiers, seamen, or marines in Her Majesty's Service..... 1d.

Provided that no such letter shall exceed half an ounce in weight, and in the case of a letter being forwarded by any soldier or sailor there shall be on the face thereof the signature of the officer in command for the time being of the corps, regiment, detachment, or ship to which the sender belongs, and provided also that any such letter to any such non-commissioned officer, private soldier, seaman, or marine specifies upon the same the corps, regiment, detachment, or ship to which the addressee may belong.

#### *Registration.*

Letters, Packets, and Newspapers may be registered at any Post Office within the Colony upon payment of an extra fee of 3d. for each article to be registered.

It is recommended that all letters, packets, &c. having valuable contents should be registered to ensure as far as possible their safe delivery, as any article not registered cannot be traced in its transmission through the post.

Articles may be registered at the General Post Office, Post Office, Launceston, from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M., and at country offices, from 9 A.M. until 5 P.M.

When Mails are despatched between the hours of 10 A.M. and 6 P.M., registered matter for such mails must be posted an hour before the closing of such mails.

Valuable articles sent in unregistered letters are exposed to risk. All inland and Australian letters or packets, therefore, which unquestionably contain coin or bank notes, even though they be posted without registration, are treated as "registered," and charged double the registration fee, in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letters, &c. which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the mail for which they are posted, are detained for the next despatch. Letters containing valuable enclosures addressed to the United Kingdom and Foreign Countries, if unregistered, are returned to the sender through the Dead Letter Office.

Letters or packets (registered or otherwise) containing gold or silver, money, jewels, or other precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be transmitted through the post to any country in the Postal Union.

Payment of an indemnity of £2 in case of the loss of a registered article will be made, except in cases beyond control, for registered articles lost inland and in transit between Tasmania, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, and New Zealand. Registered articles originating in South and Western Australia for Tasmania, and *vice versa*, do not participate in this undertaking.

#### *Enquiry concerning a Registered Article.*

Persons making enquiry respecting the delivery of registered articles will be charged a fee of 2½d. for the enquiry, the fee to be refunded in the case of any delay in delivery being attributable to the Post Office. The receipt obtained at the time of registration should be produced when making enquiry.

#### *Acknowledgment of Delivery of Registered Article.*

1. The sender of any registered article may obtain an acknowledgment of its due delivery to the addressee "*Avis de Réception*" by paying an additional fee of 2½d. in postage stamps which are to be affixed to the cover of the registered article.

2. The Postmaster or officer to whom the article is tendered must see that it bears the acknowledgment fee in postage stamps in addition to the proper postage and registration fee, as he will be held responsible for any deficiency. He must write clearly the name of the sender and the office of origin on the back of the article. He must then proceed to obliterate the postage stamps and impress the date stamp of his office on the article in the usual manner, and also impress the letters "A.R." on the address side alongside the stamps.

3. The Postmaster or officer must see that the impression of the date stamp of his office is quite legible, so that the office from which the article is delivered may easily recognise the name of the office of origin. If the impression of the date stamp be not clear and legible, the name of the office must be written in ink alongside the date stamp.

**NOTE FOR POSTMASTERS.**—Postmasters are instructed that, before forwarding any registered letter through the post, they are to mark on the front or face of the envelope a cross in red lead pencil, the full size of the envelope, thus:—



### *Prepayment of Postage.*

The postage upon all letters, packets, and newspapers should be prepaid by affixing stamps thereon. The stamps must be affixed upon the outside of all letters above the address written upon them, as by "The Post Office Act" no Postmaster is bound to take notice of or pass any stamp affixed to any other part of a letter. Postage on a large number of letters or packets posted at the same time is, however, accepted in cash, except to Queensland and West Australia.

### *Licences to sell Stamps.*

The Postmaster-General grants licences to sell stamps to respectable persons on application, if it is satisfactorily proved that the issue of such licence is for the convenience of the public.

### *Unpaid and Insufficiently-paid Letters, &c.*

Unpaid or insufficiently paid letters are sent on to destination and are charged on delivery with double the deficient postage due thereon.

Insufficiently prepaid packets addressed to Postal Union countries are forwarded to destination and charged on delivery with double the deficient postage thereon, but packets wholly unpaid are not sent. Packets not sent are forwarded to the Dead Letter Office, whence they are returned to the senders.

Newspapers unpaid or insufficiently paid are not sent.

### *Special Request Letters.*

All letters having the names and addresses of the senders thereof printed or written on the address side of the envelopes with a request that such letters be returned if not claimed or delivered within a stated period, will be returned by the General Post Office at the expiration of such period to the writers or senders thereof.

**NOTE.**—Postmasters are requested to pay strict attention to the above rule, and return under cover to the Secretary, General Post Office, such letters as may remain unclaimed at the expiration of the period endorsed thereon.

### **LATE LETTERS.**

Late letters for inland and intercolonial ship mails are charged at a uniform fee of 2d. extra each. This regulation applies also to loose letters sent to or from any other Australian Colony in the ship's box or bag, the deficiency in default being charged at the destination of such letters. On English mail days at Hobart (when the mail closes at 6 P.M.) letters for the United Kingdom may be posted until 7 P.M., at an extra single rate of postage.

Late newspapers, 1d. each.

### **UNCLAIMED LETTERS.**

All letters and packets are kept for one month at the address waiting delivery, and at the end of each month are forwarded to the Dead Letter Office, Hobart.

If received from other countries, such letters are advertised as unclaimed for two months, and are then returned to the office of origin.

Unclaimed letters, &c., originating in Tasmania, are not advertised, but opened at the Dead Letter Office, Hobart, and returned to the writer.

### **POST CARDS.**

1. Post Cards are issued of the value of 1d. each, and Reply Post Cards of the value of 3d. each. No stamp cut from a Postcard will be accepted in payment of other postage.

2. 1d. Post Cards can be transmitted between places in Tasmania and to the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, New Hebrides, Fiji, and British New Guinea; also, with additional postage of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each (to be affixed by means of adhesive stamps), to the United Kingdom and any country or Colony in the Postal Union.

3. The front or stamped side is intended for the address only, in addition to the officially printed words "Post Card," &c. There must be nothing else written, printed, or otherwise impressed on it, nor must there be any writing or printing across the stamp. On the reverse side any communication, whether of the nature of a letter or otherwise, may be written or printed. Nothing whatever may be attached excepting an adhesive  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. stamp in payment of additional postage, nor may the card be folded, cut, or otherwise altered. If any of these rules be infringed the card will be charged 2d. on delivery.

4. Private cards bearing adhesive stamps may also be used as Post Cards. They must be composed of ordinary cardboard, not thicker than the material used for the Official Post Card, and must measure not less than 4 in. by 3 in. nor more than 5½ in. by 3½ in. They are subject to the rules stated in Clause 3, except as regards cutting and altering. If intended for transmission to places beyond the Australasian Colonies, they must bear on the address side the printed words "Post Card," and, in the case of Reply Post Cards, the reply-half must bear the printed words "Reply Post Card."

5. Should a Post Card be observed to bear upon it anything of an obscene, libellous, or obviously objectionable nature, it will not be delivered.

When, owing to a great and unusual influx of letters, books, &c., the transmission or delivery of the letters would be delayed if the whole mail were dealt with without distinction, Post Cards may be kept back until the next despatch or delivery.

### *Advertising by means of Post Cards.*

Any person who places an additional Stamp of One Penny on a Post Card has the right of exhibition of such Card for 14 days on exterior of any one Post Office in Tasmania otherwise than at Hobart or Launceston.

### *Letter Cards.*

Letter Cards are issued similar in form to Reply Post Cards, but may be closed against inspection. If anything, however, is enclosed therein, they will be regarded as letters, and treated accordingly.

### PACKETS CONTAINING GOLD.

The Postage on all Packets containing Gold only, received at any Post Office for delivery within this Colony, exclusive of the Registration Fee of 3d., is as under :—

For any weight not exceeding 1 ounce ..... 2d.  
For each additional ounce or portion thereof ..... 2d.

For places beyond the Colony current letter rate is charged.

### COMMERCIAL PAPERS, BOOK, AND PACKET REGULATIONS.

#### PREPARATION FOR POST.

Packets may be sent through the post :—

Without a cover (but not fastened with anything adhesive, such as gum, postage stamp, sealing wax, &c.) :

In a cover entirely open at one end or side, or with the flap left unsealed, or fastened with a binder. If the cover be slit the opening must be to the full extent of the end or side, and the contents must be easy of withdrawal. For the greater security of the contents the packet may be tied with string, but in such case postal officials are authorised to cut or untie the string, but if they do so they must securely tie up the packets. Officers will, however, if possible satisfy themselves as to the contents without withdrawing them.

The cover may bear the sender's name and address, and the description of contents may be endorsed thereon.

Packets may be tied with string, but officers of the department may cut the string to examine the contents, and tie the packet up again.

Samples of seeds, drugs, &c., which cannot be sent as open packets, may be enclosed in bags or boxes, fastened so as to be easily undone and re-fastened. If addressed to places in the Colony, they may be sent in closed transparent bags.

NOTE.—If the above conditions be not complied with, the packets are regarded as insufficiently paid letters, and charged accordingly.

#### WEIGHT AND DIMENSIONS OF PACKETS.

##### Weight.

Not to exceed 3 lbs. ; but if conveyed by horseback or on foot the weight should not exceed 1 lb.

##### Dimensions.

No packet to exceed 2 feet in length or 1 foot in breadth or depth or to be of inconvenient form.

(The rule regarding dimensions of a packet not to apply to packets bearing a frank stamp and marked "On Public Service only.")

### ARTICLES THAT MAY BE SENT AS PACKETS.

#### Acceptances.

Accounts and Invoices, receipted or unreceipted, the remark, "With thanks" will be allowed, but either printed or written communications in the nature of a letter or of the character of actual or personal correspondence, by code or otherwise, are chargeable as letters. Invoices may be receipted, and may advise when or how the goods are forwarded, but may contain no other written matter, nor anything in the nature of actual or personal correspondence by code or otherwise. They may, however, bear the following trade notices, whether printed or impressed with a rubber or other stamp :—"All empties returned must be advised ;" "When remitting, please return the statement to be receipted ;" "Terms, cash in advance ;" "Terms, 2½ per cent. discount for cash ;" "This settles your account up to date ;" "Cheque will oblige." Anything, however, of a general character printed in ordinary type may be enclosed with accounts, provided it is not of the nature of a personal correspondence.

#### Affidavits.

Balance-sheets and reports (printed) of public societies and companies.

Bankers' packets, containing bank notes, cheques, cheque-books, drafts, or orders sent to or by any bank. *Bank notes, packets containing remittances together with any necessary schedule thereof, sent from one bank to another, and pass-books and weekly and half-yearly returns from or to a bank within the Colony, may be wholly enclosed if properly endorsed as to contents.*

#### Bills of exchange.

Bills of lading and ships' manifests.

Bottles containing fluid, &c., very securely corked so that their contents cannot escape, and packed in boxes sufficiently strong so as to prevent breakage of the bottles and damage to the mails. To offices within the Colony only.

#### Briefs.

Cards, either plain or bearing printed matter, or pictures, or both, (the name only of the addressee may be written on the face of such cards).

Catalogues, printed. (Prices in figures may be written.)

Circulars, i.e. letters wholly printed, engraved, lithographed, chromographed, or produced by other mechanical process, except the copying press and the type-writer, intended for transmission in identical terms to several persons (the name of the addressee may, however, be added in writing).

Circulars printed in imitation of the type-writer, provided that at least twenty copies in identical terms are brought to the Post Office and handed in to the officer in charge.

Commercial Papers, Inland and Intercolonial only (see page 27 for description of articles under this head).

Deeds, or copies thereof.

Depositions.

Drafts.

Drawings.

Gold (special rate, see page 32).

Insurance documents, not being in the nature of a letter.

Engravings.

Examination Papers, printed or written.

Invoices or bills of parcels. (See Accounts).  
 Legal documents, not being in the nature of a letter.  
 Malt, samples of, in air-tight tins.  
 Manuscript for printing.  
 Maps.  
 Merchandise. Queensland will not accept merchandise other than by Parcel Post.  
 Mineral specimens.  
 Music, written.  
 Notices of meetings, of subscriptions or premiums due, printed, engraved, lithographed, or produced by other mechanical process (names, addresses, dates, objects of the meeting, and amounts only to be inserted in writing).  
 Obliterated stamps (inland and intercolonially only).  
 Paintings.  
 Paper.  
 Parchments or vellum.  
 Pass-books or cards connected with any society.  
 Patterns (manufacturers' or trade mark and prices may accompany them).  
 Pay-sheets.  
 Photographs (not on glass, except in cases of leather or other strong material).  
 Pictures.  
 Placards.  
 Plans.  
 Policies of insurance.  
 Powers of attorney.  
 Prices current, printed (prices of articles included therein may be filled in in writing).  
 Printed matter.  
 Printers' proofs.  
 Prints.  
 Prospectuses, printed.  
 Proxy forms or notices, in which may be inserted such particulars as date, signature, name of proxy, date of meeting, name of shareholder or member, and number of votes, provided that nothing appears in the document in writing or print which does not form part of the document as a legal instrument.  
 Queen Bees, and live but harmless entomological specimens, to reciprocating Countries other than the United Kingdom, Russia, and New South Wales, under special regulations, as follows, and also by Parcels Post—  
 Size of box or cage not to exceed 12 inches x 6 inches x 4 inches.  
 Each box or cage to bear a label, securely attached, giving name and address of sender and particulars of contents.  
 Boxes, &c., posted in violation of these conditions, or containing poisonous or dangerous live specimens, or improperly or insecurely packed, will not be transmitted.  
 Bee Bags having contents must not be enclosed in other bags, but *must be sent separately*, and care must be exercised in handling them, also to keep them from being covered by any other mail bags.

Receipts. (See Accounts).  
 Recognizances.  
 Reports (printed) of Societies or Public Companies.  
 Returns or periodical statements on Government Service, if so endorsed on the cover.  
 Samples (manufacturers' or trade mark and price may accompany them).  
 Scrip.  
 Seeds. Packets of seeds, from seedsmen, in closed wrappers posted in Tasmania, for delivery within the Colony.  
 Specifications.  
 Spent letters, *i.e.*, letters that have clearly served their original purpose or are at least two months old (inland and intercolonially only).  
 Stock-sheets.  
 Tasmanian Government Debentures or Treasury Bills.  
 Travellers' cards or circulars (inland and intercolonially only).  
 Valentines, printed.  
 Way-bills.  
 Other articles similar to above can also be forwarded as packets.  
 All packets containing jewelry, or articles of high value, must be registered, or they will be officially registered, and charged registration fee on delivery.  
 None of the articles mentioned in above list will be forwarded as packets beyond the limits of the Colony, if the law or postal regulations of the Colony or Country to which they may be addressed prohibit their reception into such Colony or Country as packets.  
 If any articles which can be sent by post, only if paid as letters, are posted bearing the packet rate of postage, they will be treated as insufficiently paid letters.  
 Officers of the Post Office may examine the contents of any package for the purposes of ascertaining whether they are in accordance with these regulations; but such officers must securely refasten any packet so opened.

**SAVINGS BANKS, BUILDING SOCIETY, OR REGISTERED FRIENDLY SOCIETY PACKETS, DEPOSITORS' MONEYS AND PASS BOOKS.**

1. Packets containing Money or Deposit Books sent to or from any Actuary, Secretary, or Manager of any Savings Bank, Building Society, or Registered Friendly Society within the Colony, not exceeding 4 ozs. in weight, are charged One Penny only, which must be paid by means of Tasmanian Postage Stamps of that value.
2. Postmasters are bound to register all such Packets without any further charge than the One Penny postage; but each Packet must be marked "Savings Bank Packet Only," or as the case may be, and bear the signature of the sender or person forwarding it underneath those words.
3. Any person sending, or causing to be sent, through the Post Office any Packet marked as a "Savings Bank Packet," "Building Society Packet," or "Friendly Society Packet," which contains any other article, matter, or communication than Moneys, Deposit Books, or communication relating to the deposit or repayment of moneys in such Savings Bank, Building, or Friendly Society, will be subjected to a penalty not exceeding £10.
4. The Manager or Actuary of any Savings Bank, Building, or Friendly Society is bound to give notice and to exhibit to the nearest

Postmaster the contents of any Packet which may be of other description than as above permitted, under a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### ARTICLES NOT ALLOWED TO BE SENT AS PACKETS.

Gold or silver money, jewels or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duty.

Glass, and perishable substances such as game, fish, flesh, fruit, vegetables, &c.

Anything liable to injure the person of any officer of the Post Office, or the contents of a mail.

Photographs on glass, when not in strong cases.

Anything sealed or fastened against inspection.

Anything in the nature of a letter, unless wholly printed or lithographed, &c.

Packets bearing on the outside or containing any profane, obscene, or libellous address, signature, picture, or thing.

Packets posted in fraud or violation of the Postal or Customs law.

Notices of Lotteries, Schemes of Chance, &c., in open envelopes, are not distributed by post in Queensland.

#### TRANSMISSION OF QUEEN BEES, &c. BY POST.

Queen Bees and live but harmless entomological specimens will be transmitted by post (in bags sufficiently perforated to allow of ventilation) to reciprocating countries, other than Russia and New South Wales. To the United Kingdom by parcel post only.

*Conditions.*—All live specimens must be secured in strong, safe, and properly ventilated boxes or cages of wood or metal. Specimens enclosed in cardboard or other fragile material will not be forwarded.

Size of box or cage not to exceed 12 inches × 6 inches × 4 inches. Each box or cage to bear a label, securely attached, giving name and address of sender thereof, and particulars of contents therein.

Boxes, &c. posted in violation of these conditions, or containing poisonous or dangerous live specimens, or improperly or insecurely packed, will not be transmitted.

Rate of Postage—Every 2 ounces or under, 1d.

Bee Bags having contents must not be enclosed in other bags, but must be sent separately, and care must be exercised in handling them, also to keep them from being covered by any other mail bags.

#### BOOKS AND MAGAZINES.

The following and similar articles are forwarded at book rate of 1d. per 8 ozs., and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each additional 4 ozs., up to 3 lbs., by the Inland post. To the Australian Colonies and Fiji the rate is 1d. for every 4 ozs. and under up to 3 lbs.:—

Printed Books, Pamphlets, Reviews, and all other periodical publications that do not come within the definition of Newspapers, Printed Music (bound or loose), Photographs, &c., bound and published in book form.

Catalogues, Reports of Societies, and other such matter, if printed and published in book form and containing no writing whatever.

Magazines, Inland and to the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and New Zealand, 1d. for the first 8 ozs., and  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each succeeding 4 ozs. up to 3 lbs. To the other Colonies the rate is the same as that for Books.

Parcels not to exceed 3 lbs. in weight.

No articles of merchandise can be forwarded to Queensland but such as are sent as *bonâ fide* patterns or samples, having no intrinsic value of their own except as patterns or samples.

#### NEWSPAPERS, INLAND & INTERCOLONIAL:—RATES OF POSTAGE, REGULATIONS, HOUR OF POSTING, &c.

1. Newspapers printed and posted in the Colony for delivery at any place within the Colony beyond the boundaries of the City or Town at which they may be published, and posted within seven days from the date of publication... Free.
2. Newspapers printed and posted in the Colony for transmission to New Zealand, if posted within seven days from the date of publication ..... Free.
3. Newspapers posted in Tasmania for transmission to the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Western Australia, of the weight of 10 ounces and under, irrespective of the date of publication  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each.  
Each additional 10 ounces and under .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.
4. Newspapers and other periodical publications for Queensland, not exceeding 2 ozs. in weight .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each.  
Each additional 2 ozs. or fraction thereof .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d.
5. Newspapers printed and posted in the Colony after seven days from the date of publication .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each.
6. Newspapers posted within any city, town, or district in the Colony for delivery by letter carriers within such city, town, or district .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each.
7. Newspapers received from places beyond the limits of the Colony shall be delivered free; but when re-posted, whether in single numbers or stitched monthly parts of two or more numbers, shall be subject to a charge for each number .....  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. each.
8. Bulk parcels of newspapers posted by a registered newspaper publisher or newsvendor (no parcel containing less than six newspapers to pass at bulk rates), per pound or fraction thereof ..... 1d.
9. The *Hobart Gazette*, published by the Government Printer, and *The Council of Agriculture Gazette*, published by Council of Agriculture, and the *Braille Newspaper*, published by the Society for the Blind, are exempted from the above rates, and may be posted for delivery in any part of the Colony free of charge.
10. Newspapers liable to postage must be fully prepaid by affixing stamps of sufficient value.
11. Newspapers for despatch to all places must be posted half an hour before the closing of the mail.

#### REGULATIONS.

Any publication coming within the following description shall be deemed a newspaper:—

Any publication consisting wholly or in great part of political or other news, or of articles relating thereto, or to other current topics, with or without advertisements, shall be deemed a newspaper, provided that it be printed and published in numbers at intervals of not more than one



month, that it have the full title and date of publication printed at the top of the first page, and the whole or part of the title and the date of publication printed at the top of every subsequent page, (this applies also to "Tables of Contents" and "Indices"), with or without a supplement, consisting wholly or in great part of such matter as aforesaid, or of advertisements, printed on paper stitched or unstitched, or consisting wholly or in part of engravings, prints, or lithographs illustrative of articles in the paper. It must in every case be published with the newspaper, and having the title and date of publication of the newspaper printed at the top of every page, or, if it consists of engravings, prints, or lithographs, at the top of every sheet or side. Handbills, insets, or advertisement sheets are not supplements.

Collected numbers of any publication registered as a newspaper shall not be transmitted through the post as a single newspaper, but postage will be charged on each number of issue comprised therein.

Every newspaper posted in Tasmania must be sent without a cover, or enclosed in a cover open at both ends, and there shall not be in or upon any such newspaper or the cover thereof any printing, writing, or thing whatsoever other than the contents of such newspaper as printed by the publisher thereof, and the printed or written name and address of sender thereof, excepting only the direction on the outside thereof or any mark intended to call attention to any paragraph therein.

Any breach of the foregoing provisions will render the person convicted liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.

When two or more newspapers (not being bulk parcels) to the same address are tied together, the outside newspaper must bear on its face or address side the full postage for each paper, and so tied that the number of papers can be counted and date of each ascertained.

#### EXEMPTIONS FROM POSTAGE.

[The attention of those authorised to frank is drawn to the fact that since Tasmania joined the Postal Union the privilege of franking does not extend beyond the Australian Colonies. All letters and packets for England and Foreign Countries must bear full rates of postage, otherwise they will be charged full rates in addition to a fine on arrival at their destination.]

1. Petitions and addresses forwarded to the Governor by Post, if such Petitions and addresses are sent without covers, or in covers open at the ends or sides, and Letters and Packets sent by the Governor.

2. Letters and packets addressed to any responsible Minister of the Crown.

3. Letters and packets sent by, or addressed to, Members of Parliament during any Session of Parliament.

4. Letters and Packets on Her Majesty's Service from the Admiral, Commodore, or Captain of Her Majesty's Ships of War.

5. Municipal and Road Trust Accounts when transmitted to the Auditor-General and marked Municipal or Road Trust Accounts, as the case may be, together with the name of the sender.

6. Telegrams when sent in the Authorised Envelope and subscribed with the name and address of the operator in charge of station by whom sent.

7. Letters and packets to and from every Registrar and Vaccinator under Section 26 of "Vaccination Act," 45 Vict. No. 2. provided such letters, &c. are in covers open at the sides, and directed to or bear the signature of such Registrar or Vaccinator, and endorsed with the words "Vaccination Act."

8. Demands and Receipts for Land Tax, Rural Police Rate, Road Rate, Town Board Rate, Rabbit Rate, Codlin Moth Rate, Wharfage Rate, or any Municipal Rate by any Collector: Provided that there is endorsed thereon, or upon the cover of the same, the words "Land Tax," "Rural Police Rate," or "Road Rate," as the case may be, together with the signature of the Collector.

9. Letters containing the amount of any Land Tax, Rural Police Rate, Road Rate, Town Board Rate, Rabbit Rate, Codlin Moth Rate, Wharfage Rate, or any Municipal Rate: Provided that there is endorsed thereon, or upon the cover of the same, the words "Land Tax," "Rural Police Rate," or "Road Rate," as the case may be, together with the signature of the sender.

10. Letters and packets addressed to or from the Statistician or any Statistical Collector when marked on their envelopes as containing Statistical information only.

11. Letters and packets containing any Summons or other process transmitted by the Registrar or Bailiff of any Court under "The Small Debts Act" to the Bailiff of any other Court under the said Act for service: Provided that there is endorsed thereon, or upon the cover of the same, the words "Process under Small Debts Act," together with the signature and office of the sender.

12. Letters containing any Inquisition taken by any Coroner and forwarded to the Registrar of the Supreme Court: Provided that there is endorsed thereon, or upon the cover of the same, the words "Coroner's Inquisition," together with the name of the sender.

13. Unclaimed, undelivered, refused, detained, or other letters or packets which have been opened by the Postmaster-General, under the authority of "The Post Office Act," and which are returned to the respective writers or senders thereof: Provided that there is endorsed thereon, or upon the cover of the same, the description of such letters, together with the signature of the officer who shall have opened such letters or packets.

14. Letters and packets addressed to the Postmaster-General containing requisitions and remittances for Stamps, or paper or documents requiring to be impressed with Stamp Duty: Provided the envelope of every such letter or packet is marked as containing "Remittance for Stamps," or "Instrument for Impressed Stamp Duty," as the case may be, together with the name and address of the sender written thereunder.

15. Letters addressed to the Postmaster-General, or the Treasurer, and relating to any Deposit in any Post Office, and Packets containing



any Post Office Savings Bank Book: Provided there is endorsed thereon, or on the cover of the same, the words "Post Office Savings Bank" with the signature of the sender.

16. Packets enclosing only Maps or Plans transmitted by or addressed to the Minister of Lands and Works or the Commissioner of Crown Lands; or containing only Returns of Births, Deaths, Marriages, or Baptisms transmitted in compliance with Law by any person whose duty it is to transmit the same to any person whose duty it is to receive the same; or containing Depositions in cases of Felony or Misdemeanor addressed to or transmitted by the Attorney-General or other officer appointed for the prosecution of offences; or containing printed forms transmitted by or addressed to the Government Printer: Provided that the contents of all such packets are stated on the outside thereof, and such statement is subscribed with the name and address of the sender of the Packet.

17. All letters or packets received at any Post Office from beyond the sea for delivery within this Colony, provided they are received in a regular mail, and not subject to any postage.

18. Letters, notices, or returns addressed to or by the Chief Inspector or any Inspector under "The Stock Act," upon matters connected with that Act, or containing any amount of contribution to the Stock Act Fund, if endorsed with the words "Stock Act" and the signature of the sender.

19. Letters and packets which are *bonâ fide* on Public Service only, and are franked by the Governor, or by any Member of the Parliament of this Colony, or by any Mayor, or Warden of a Rural Municipality, or by any one of such Officers of the Government of this Colony as are from time to time authorised by the Governor to frank Official letters and packets: Provided that there is endorsed on any such letter or packet the words "On Public Service only," and that the signature of the Governor or Member, or Warden, or of such officer as aforesaid franking the same, is subscribed to such words.

20. Letters addressed "The Collector of Beer Duty," in envelopes, bearing the Government Stamp on back.

21. Letters on matters in connection with the Tasmanian University, franked by either the Chancellor (Rev. Geo. Clarke), Vice-Chancellor (J. B. Walker, Esq.), or Registrar (Lieut.-Col. Jas. H. R. Cruickshank).

22. Printed Cards notifying to Members of Rifle Clubs to attend Inspections, Drills, or Rifle Practice.

23. Communications addressed to or by the Chief Inspector, Sub-Inspectors, and Chairmen of Boards under the "Codlin Moth Act, 1887," if endorsed with the words "Codlin Moth Act," and bearing the signature of the sender.

24. Parcels containing Insects or Fungi, addressed to Rev. E. H. Thompson, Franklin, if such parcels be marked "Insect or Fungus Specimens only," and bear the name and address of the sender.

25. Letters or Packets marked "Claims to Vote" addressed to the "Returning Officer" for any Electoral District.

26. Letters and Packets on Public Service only, sent by Police, containing replies to enquiries instituted by Collectors of Fees for maintenance in Charitable Institutions, provided there is endorsed

thereon "Reply to Charitable Institution Enquiry," together with the signature and office of the sender.

27. Letters, Packets, Returns, and Notices addressed to the Registrar-General, or to any Registrar of Births and Deaths, containing matter under "The Marriage Act, 1895," or "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1895," if endorsed on the outside thereof "Declaration under the Registration of Births and Deaths Act" or "On Registration Business only."

28. Packets containing specimens addressed to the Government Entomologist, Botanist, or other recognised officials and Members of the Board of Agriculture.

29. Returns addressed to the Chief Inspector of Mines, Launceston, endorsed "Mining and Statistical Returns only," and bearing the name and address of the Mine Manager forwarding.

NOTE.—The particular attention of all Postmasters is called to the circumstance of no Public Officer being allowed to receive Letters or Packets "On Public Service only" free, unless they be franked by a Member of Parliament, or by the Mayor or Warden of a Municipality, or one or other of the Officers to whom the Governor has granted the privilege of franking; or unless they be from a subordinate Officer to the Head of his Department; or from the Police to the Head of any Department or to Police authorities. All Letters or Packets from other parties, unless prepaid by means of Postage Stamps, must therefore be dealt with as "Unstamped," or "Insufficiently Stamped," as the case may be, unless they come under one or other of the exemptions from postage above set forth. *No Letter or Packet exceeding 2 lbs. in weight can be forwarded unless under the express authority of the Hon. the Treasurer, or when franked by a Minister of the Crown; but this does not apply to Packets to and from any Member of Parliament, or Clerk of either House of Parliament, to and from the Auditor-General, to and from the Government Printer, to and from the Customs Department, to and from the Railway Department, and to and from the Mines Department.*

#### PRIVATE BOXES.

Locked Private Boxes, of three sizes, as required, are provided at the Post Offices, Hobart and Launceston, for merchants and others, on payment of £1 ls., £1 11s. 6d., or £2 2s. per annum, at Zeehan on payment of £1 ls. or £2 2s. per annum in advance, according to the size of the box required, and at West Devonport, Queenstown, Stanley, Mathinna, Burnie, Longford, and Strahan, for a fee of £1 ls. per annum.

Payment of Box Fees to date from the 1st January; but, to suit the convenience of persons requiring boxes from the 1st April, 1st July, or 1st October, payment in advance, at the annual rate for the period—nine, six, or three months—will be received.

A key is supplied with each box (when let) without extra charge, but 2s. 6d. will be charged for each additional key supplied.

When a key is lost information should at once be given to the Secretary, General Post Office, and a new lock will be fitted to the box, and fresh key supplied, for which a charge of 7s. 6d. will be made.

Holders of Private Boxes at Hobart are supplied daily with a Mail Notice gratis.

The attention of holders of Private Boxes is specially directed to the advisability of checking all the letters taken from the box, and any that may accidentally have been missorted therein should at once be handed to an officer of the Post Office for disposal.

## PRIVATE MAIL BAGS.

Private Mail Bags are supplied to persons requiring them who reside on the route travelled by a Mail Contractor, upon payment in advance of a fee of £1 1s. per annum.

Mail Contractors are bound under their contracts to convey and deliver free of charge all bags given to them, but are not required to deviate from the usual mail route, and are on no account to be delayed.

Letters forwarded in private bags for delivery at the Post Office at which such bags are opened must bear postage at the rate of 2d. per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

## GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS.

## DELIVERIES BY LETTER CARRIERS.

There are three town deliveries daily in Hobart—viz., at 8.15 A.M., 1 P.M., and 4 P.M. On Saturdays, at 8.15 A.M. and 1 P.M. only.

In Launceston there are four deliveries daily—at 8.15 A.M., 10 A.M., 1 P.M., and 4 P.M.; and on Saturdays, three, at 8.15 A.M., 10 A.M., and 1 P.M. There is a window delivery every evening of North West Coast letters, lasting from 7.15 P.M. until 7.45 P.M.

Suburban Deliveries.—Letters, &c. are delivered in the Hobart Suburbs of New Town, Sandy Bay, Sandy Bay Lower, Mt. Stuart, and Hobart South, leaving the General Post Office at 8.15 A.M., 1 P.M., and 4 P.M.; Saturday, 9 A.M. and 1 P.M. Also in the Launceston Suburbs of Inveresk, Hawthorn, and Cataract Hill, leaving the Post Office at Launceston at 8.15 A.M. and 1 P.M., and the southern portion of Elphin Road and South Launceston, leaving the Post Office, Launceston, at 8.15 A.M., 1 P.M., and 4 P.M., the 4 P.M. delivery not being made on Saturday, and Trevallyn leaving the Post Office, Launceston, at 8.15 A.M. and 4 P.M., and Invermay leaving the Post Office, Launceston, at 4 P.M.

At Bellerive there are two deliveries daily, leaving the Post Office at 9.30 A.M. and 5 P.M.

In Zeehan and Queenstown there are two deliveries daily, leaving the Post Office at 9 A.M. and 2 P.M.

Hobart Office.—The Letter Delivery Office is open from 8.15 A.M. until 7.20 P.M. Private Boxes, at any hour. The Dead Letter Office is open from 9 A.M. until 4.30 P.M.; Saturday, until 1 P.M. The Stamp Saleroom is open from 8.30 A.M. until midnight; Saturday, closes at 10 P.M.; Sundays, 8.30 P.M. to 9.30 P.M. The Registered Letter Office is open from 9 A.M. until 6 P.M. The Parcel Post Office is open from 9 A.M. until 4 P.M.; Saturday, until 1 P.M.

Launceston Office.—Letter Delivery Office is open from 8.15 A.M. until 7.45 P.M. Private Boxes, at any hour. Window for sale of Stamps is open from 8.15 A.M. until 7.45 P.M., and after the Post Office is closed Stamps can be obtained at counter of Telegraph Office. Registered Letter Office is open from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. The Parcel Post Office is open from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M., Saturday, until 1 P.M.

Country Post Offices open from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M., or for the 8 hours daily most suitable to residents of locality. Combined Post and Telegraph Offices doing a business of upwards of 1000 messages a year open in addition for one hour in evening.

Sundays—Post Offices closed all day. Combined Post and Telegraph Offices open for one hour in evening.

A list of Combined Post and Telegraph Offices will be found in Table of Inland Mails, commencing at page 9.

Mail Notices.—Daily notices notifying arrival and departure of Mails from Hobart are supplied for £1 per annum.

Holidays.—Christmas Day and Good Friday are observed as close holidays at Post Offices throughout Tasmania. For other gazetted Public Holidays special arrangements (duly advertised) are made at Hobart and Launceston, and the Country Offices are open for one hour most convenient to the residents. No delay in arrival or transmission of Mails takes place, however.

## POSTAGE AND REVENUE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are issued to the public of the following values:—

Envelopes impressed with 2d. Stamps may be obtained in packets of 12 for 2s. 1d.

Registered Envelopes are issued at 3d. each.

Post Cards at 1d. each.

Reply Post Cards at 3d. each.

Authority may be given for the perforation of Postage Stamps with the initials of firms and others using Stamps to a large amount, but the design must be approved of.

*Impressed Stamps (Revenue).*

Documents are impressed at the Stamp Office, Hobart, with Stamps of any value required.

*Acceptance and Promissory Note Forms.*

Acceptance and Promissory Note Forms bearing Impressed Stamps ranging in values from 3d. to 2s. 6d. may be obtained from any Post Office that is also a Money Order Office; and Acceptance and Promissory Note Forms of any values can be obtained from any Postmaster, who will telegraph for same upon application.

*Exchange of Spoiled Acceptance and Promissory Note Forms.*

Where a Collector is satisfied that a Stamp has been spoiled, and has not been used for the purpose intended, he may allow other documents to be impressed to value of said stamps, provided such stamp is presented within 60 days of its becoming spoiled.

*Envelopes and Newspaper Wrappers.*

Stamps will be impressed on envelopes supplied by the public for the purpose under the following Regulations:—

- 1st. Not fewer than 480 envelopes of any one size can be received at any time.
- 2nd. No envelopes can be received for stamping which are too thin to bear the impression of the die.
- 3rd. Envelopes provided by the Post Office Department, with the proper stamp thereon, will be substituted for any which may be spoiled in the operation of stamping.
- 4th. No fee is charged for stamping.
- 5th. Payment for impressing envelopes to be made in advance.

Half-penny and one penny stamps will be impressed on newspaper wrappers provided for the purpose under similar conditions. The usual commission of 4 per cent. will be allowed on envelopes and wrappers impressed under the regulations to postmasters, and 2½ per cent. to licensed vendors.

Tasmanian Postage Stamps are repurchased at the General Post Office, Hobart, and the Post Office, Launceston, at a charge of *One Shilling in the Pound*, or according to the following scale; viz.—

For Stamps not exceeding in value 1s. 8d. ....	1d.
For Stamps exceeding 1s. 8d. in value, and not exceeding 3s. 4d. ...	2d.
For Stamps exceeding 3s. 4d. in value, and not exceeding 5s. ...	3d.
For Stamps exceeding 5s. in value and not exceeding 6s. 8d. ...	4d.
For Stamps exceeding 6s. 8d. in value, and not exceeding 8s. 4d. ...	5d.
For Stamps exceeding 8s. 4d. in value, and not exceeding 10s. ...	6d.
And so on at the rate of One Penny for every 1s. 8d., or portion of 1s. 8d.	

Stamps remitted to Government Offices in payment of revenue will be repurchased without a charge for commission, but when such stamps are presented for repurchase they must be accompanied by a Certificate that they were received in payment of Government Revenue.

Stamps will not be repurchased if mutilated, soiled, or otherwise damaged.

Application to repurchase must be made to the Officer in Charge of Stamp Sale Room.

The full addresses of the payees must be given, so that there may be no difficulty in delivery of the Orders.

In issuing these Orders postmasters must be guided by the several clauses of the instructions issued. Gummed labels must be affixed to the Orders.

Telegraph Money Orders may be obtained and made payable at all Money Order Offices which are also telegraph offices in Tasmania, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, Western Australia, and New Zealand,\* on payment of the usual charge for a message of ten words, in addition to the money order commission.

NOTE.—Remitter required to advise payee by wire.

#### REGULATIONS FOR POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

1. Every Money Order Office is also a Post Office Savings Bank and open daily for the receipt and payment of money during the hours appointed for the transaction of Money Order business. The Banks at Hobart, Launceston, and Zeehan are closed at noon on Saturdays, but open again, Hobart and Launceston 7.30 to 8.30 P.M., Zeehan 7 to 9 P.M., for receipt of deposits only. Gormanston Bank opens on Saturdays in addition to ordinary hours from 7 to 8 o'clock in the evening.

2. Deposits of one shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, will be received from any depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks; but no interest will be allowed on any sum exceeding £150.

All deposits must be made in cash, or in notes issued by Tasmanian Banks, or in coupons on Tasmanian Government Debentures, or by twelve penny postage stamps on forms supplied for that purpose.

3. Interest will be given on the money deposited in them at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on sums not exceeding £150.

4. Depositors in these Banks have *Direct Government Security* for the prompt repayment of their deposits.

5. A depositor in any one of the Post Office Banks can continue his deposits at any other of such Banks, or he can withdraw his money at the Post Office Bank most convenient to him.

6. The strictest secrecy is observed with regard to the names of the depositors in the Post Office Savings Bank and the amount of their deposits.

7. Married women may deposit money in the Post Office Savings Bank, and money so deposited will be deemed to be her separate property, and repayments will be made to the receipt of such married woman alone without the concurrence of her husband. Any woman who marries while she is a depositor should forward a certificate of her marriage, and the deposits will be entered in her married name and will remain her separate property. If any deposit is made by a married woman of moneys of her husband without his consent, the husband may apply to a Judge of the Supreme Court, who may order such deposit to be paid to the husband. Moneys deposited by a husband in the name of his wife in fraud of his creditors may be followed for the benefit of the creditors. Deposits belonging to a married woman may be bequeathed by her by will.

8. Money may be deposited by or on behalf of *Minors*.

9. Friendly Societies duly certified or registered, may deposit their funds, but a copy of their rules must be sent to the Postmaster-General. Charitable and Provident Societies may also deposit their funds on similar conditions.

10. *Postage Free*.—Depositors' Bank Books and correspondence on Post Office Savings Bank business are sent free of postage.

#### SMALL SAVINGS BY MEANS OF POSTAGE STAMPS.

Any person desirous of saving One Shilling by means of penny contributions for deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank may do so by purchasing with every penny saved a Penny Stamp and affixing it to a form to be obtained at any Money Order Office. Instructions as to this form are printed thereon.

#### POSTAL NOTES.

For the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office, Postal Notes may be obtained at any Post Office, which is also a Money Order Office.

They are payable only at Money Order Offices.

The values of the Notes have been so arranged that any sum of shillings and sixpences up to one pound may be remitted by not more than two of these notes.

Stamps to the amount of Five Pence may be affixed to any Postal Note. Payment of full value of note in addition to stamps attached will be made.

Should the spaces in a Postal Note, for name of payee and paying office, be not filled up, the note will be payable to the bearer at any Money Order Office in the Colony. There is no objection to the insertion of the word "bearer" in the space appointed for name of payee.

If the sender wishes the Note paid to any specified person, at any specified office, the name of the person and office (*which must be a Money Order Office*) should be written in the proper places. After these particulars are once filled in they must not be altered. If a

Postal Note be payable to any specified person, that person must sign the receipt, and if a person other than the payee presents the Note, the person who presents it must also receipt the Note.

Postal Notes may be crossed (like cheques), when they will only be paid through a bank.

If a Postal Note which is crossed is presented for payment through a bank, with the name of such bank stamped on the face thereof, that name may be accepted as a sufficient receipt for the amount of the Note, and the Note may be paid without any other receipt.

A Note which is crossed, if presented for payment through a Bank, may be paid at any Money Order Office in Tasmania, notwithstanding that the blank has been filled in with the name of some particular office.

Postal Notes containing alterations or erasures, or cut, defaced, or mutilated, will not be paid in ordinary course. Special application on the subject must be made to the Postmaster-General.

Postal Notes are payable for six months after date of issue. Fresh poundage (the same as that originally charged) must be paid in stamps for every additional six months, or portion thereof, that have elapsed after issue and before presentation for payment.

After once paying a Postal Note, all liability on the part of the Department ceases.

Every person to whom a Postal Note is issued should keep a record of the number, date, and name of office of issue, to facilitate inquiry if the Note should be lost.

Further particulars can be obtained at any Post Office in the Colony.

#### To Postmasters.

When a Postal Note is sold, it must be signed by the Postmaster in the place appointed for his signature, and a clear impression of the date-stamp must be affixed in the place marked for "Stamp of Issuing Office."

A Postmaster upon paying a Postal Note shall immediately stamp it with the proper stamp in the place provided, specifying the date, and thereby cancel the Note.

No Postal Note shall be paid after the expiration of six months after the month of issue, until reference has been made to the Head Office of the issuing Colony to ascertain whether a duplicate has been granted.

Applications for supplies of Postal Notes must be made by requisition, in the same manner as for supplies of Stamps; the envelopes containing the remittances must be sent, registered, to the Accountant, General Post Office.

#### EXCHANGE OF POSTAL NOTES BETWEEN VICTORIA, SOUTH AUSTRALIA, QUEENSLAND, NEW SOUTH WALES, AND TASMANIA.

Postal Notes issued in Tasmania are payable at all Money Order Offices in Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, and New South Wales, and Postal Notes issued in the latter colonies are payable in Tasmania.

Upon payment of any such Postal Note, the payee will be charged a commission equal to that charged for the issue of a Postal Note of equal value, such commission to be attached in unobliterated Tasmanian stamps.

#### INDIA.

Amounts of Money Orders issued in Tasmania on India are paid in Rupees, Annas, and Pies; the Rupee being the standard of value in India.

As, however, the value of the Rupee is subject to constant variation, no tables of conversion can be given. All Orders on India are issued in sterling, and the equivalent in Rupees is settled by the Post Office at Bombay on the arrival of the Advice List from Hobart.

Money Orders drawn in India on Tasmania are issued in the currency of India, and the equivalent in sterling is calculated by the Post Office at Bombay at the rate of exchange current in India at the date of preparing the Advice List for despatch to Hobart.

\* Orders passed through the London Office are subject to deductions—see above.

† Austria.

The amounts of Money Orders issued in the United Kingdom upon Austria are converted at the London Office into Francs and Centimes, as shown in this column; and at the office of Vienna such sums are converted into Austro-Hungarian money in accordance with the value of the piece of 20 Francs in gold, current in that city on the day on which the Advice Lists are received from London.

## PARCELS POST.

## TASMANIAN INLAND PARCEL POST.

*General Regulations.*

1. Parcel Post business will be transacted at the General Post Office, Hobart, and at the Post Office, Launceston, between the hours of 9 A.M. and 4 P.M. daily, and on Saturday from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M.; at all other Parcel Post Offices from 9 A.M. until 5 P.M.

2. *Weight.*—The weight of a Parcel must not exceed 7 lbs.

3. *Size.*—Limit of size of Parcel 3 ft. 6 in. in length, or 6 ft. in length and girth combined.

4. *Postage.*—Postage to be prepaid in Stamps.

The Stamps should be affixed to an adhesive label obtainable at any Parcel Post Office, which will be attached to the Parcel by the Officer receiving the same after he ascertains the weight.

5. *Parcels to be prepaid.*—No Parcel will be accepted unless the postage is fully prepaid.

6. *Irregularly posted.*—Parcels posted in letter boxes, or not duly handed to an Officer of the Department will be regarded as irregularly posted; if not exceeding 3 lbs. in weight they will be forwarded as letters or packets, but if in excess of that weight they will be returned to the sender on payment of Sixpence for each Parcel.

7. *Registration.*—Parcels may be registered upon payment in Stamps of an additional fee of Threepence, and for an additional Twopence a receipt will be obtained on delivery, which will be forwarded to the sender by post.

8. *Prohibited Articles.*—No Parcel may contain a letter, money (coin or bank notes), or consist of or contain two or more Parcels or other Postal Packets of the same or of different descriptions, addressed to different persons at different addresses. This regulation does not prohibit the enclosure of invoices, business cards, or printed circulars, or advertisements, price lists, particulars of contents of or receipted account for such Parcel. No Parcel must bear on the outside any indecent, obscene, profane, or libellous address, signature, marks, words or designs, or contain any indecent or obscene print, photograph, lithograph, writing, engraving, book or card, or other indecent or obscene article; nor must there be enclosed in any Parcel articles of an offensive nature, or liable to sudden combustion or of a dangerous, destructive, or explosive character. Live animals, reptiles, butter, eggs, or anything likely to do injury to persons or parcels, will not be forwarded. Parcels containing fruit, liquids, or semi-liquids, such as jellies, pickles, varnish, paint, medicines, &c., will be accepted conditionally upon their being so securely packed that the contents cannot escape, and the vessels in which they are contained are sufficiently strong to prevent breakage in transmission.



9. *Parcels liable to Examination.*—All Parcels are liable to examination by Officers authorised in that behalf by the Postmaster-General; and in the event of any prohibited article being found in any Parcel, such Parcel, according to the nature of its contents, may be charged as an insufficiently-paid letter, or be confiscated. Should the contents of any Parcel become offensive or otherwise objectionable while in the possession of the Department, it may be forthwith destroyed. It is not obligatory that Parcels should be open at the ends, but it is advisable that they be not sealed, so that if it be considered necessary they may be conveniently examined.

10. *Offices of Receipt and Despatch.*—Parcels will only be received at and despatched from the offices included in the list of Parcel Post Offices.

11. *How addressed.*—All Parcels, in addition to the name and address of the person to whom the Parcel is directed, must bear the name and address of the sender legibly written or printed on the left corner of the side bearing the address. This will facilitate the return of undelivered or unclaimed parcels.

12. *Deception as to place of posting.*—If a Parcel be forwarded under cover to a Post Office, with a request that it may be re-posted, on the request being complied with it will be endorsed with the words, "Received under cover from \_\_\_\_\_ and re-posted at \_\_\_\_\_"

13. *Re-directed Parcels.*—Parcels will be re-directed, and delivered within the Colony, on the written application of the sender or addressee, on payment of an additional fee of Sixpence for each Parcel.

14. *Unclaimed or undelivered Parcels.*—Unclaimed or undelivered Parcels will be retained for delivery one calendar month from date of receipt, and at the expiration of that time will be forwarded to the General Post Office, Hobart, whence they will be returned to the senders on payment of a fee of Sixpence each parcel.

15. *Return of Parcels (special) if endorsed.*—Parcels bearing a request for the return before the period named in the foregoing regulation will be so returned, if such request be endorsed above the name and address of the sender. An additional fee of Sixpence will be required to be paid on each Parcel before delivery to the sender.

16. *Refused Parcels.*—Parcels, the delivery of which is refused by the addressees, will be at once returned to the sender upon payment of an additional fee of Sixpence for each Parcel.

17. *Delivery.*—The addressees of Parcels must take delivery at the Post Office to which the Parcels are addressed. In all cases senders should advise the addressee by post of the despatch of Parcels, so as to ensure prompt delivery.

18. *Delay in transmission.*—While the Department will use every effort to forward Parcels to destination as promptly as possible, it cannot undertake in all cases to forward them by the next mail after posting.

19. *Torn and damaged Parcels.*—Parcels torn or damaged in transit will be refastened and secured as far as practicable. Parcels without addresses will be returned to the sender, if possible. Although every care will be taken, the Postmaster-General will not accept any responsibility for damage, delay, or loss of any parcel under any circumstances.

20. *Complaints.*—Applications or complaints regarding Parcels should be addressed to the Secretary, General Post Office, Hobart.

21. *Time for Posting.*—When mails are despatched between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M., Parcels for such mails must be posted an hour before the closing of such mails.

NOTE.—Special attention is called to Section 6, Inland Parcel Post Regulations.

## INTERCOLONIAL, BRITISH, AND FOREIGN PARCELS POST.

### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. Limit of weight of parcel, (unless otherwise specified in Table of Rates), 11 lbs.
2. Limit of size (unless otherwise specified in Table of Rates), maximum 3 feet 6 inches in length, or 6 feet in girth and length combined.
3. All postage must be fully prepaid by stamps affixed to the parcels (see Table of Rates).
4. The sender of any parcel will be required to sign a declaration stating its contents and the value thereof, the declaration then to be attached to the parcel. Parcels with regard to which a false declaration is made may be confiscated. Parcels will only be forwarded at the risk of the owners.
5. Articles of a dangerous, damaging, or offensive character will not be received or delivered. All prohibited articles may be forthwith confiscated.
6. No parcel may consist of or contain two or more parcels or other postal packets (of the same or of different descriptions) addressed to different persons at different addresses. If such parcel be discovered, it will be sent forward charged at the unpaid rate applicable to such contents.
7. Parcels will only be received at and despatched from Post Offices in Tasmania accessible by rail or coach.
8. Parcels on arrival in Tasmania will be subject to examination, and in cases where Customs Duties are payable the same must be paid before the parcels are delivered.
9. The necessary Customs entries will be passed free of cost to the addressees of parcels received.
10. Should a letter, or any writing in the nature of a letter, be found in any parcel, such enclosure will be charged full letter rate as from the office of despatch, together with a fine of an amount equal to the amount of postage.
11. When parcels are ready for delivery from the Offices at Hobart or Launceston, or are forwarded for delivery from a Post Office, the addressees will be advised of the fact by a printed circular.
12. Parcels will be retained at the Post Offices to which they may be sent for delivery one month, when, if unclaimed, they will be re-transmitted to the General Post Office, Hobart. But such as may be refused by the addressees will be at once forwarded to that Office.
13. If a parcel cannot be delivered within the time specified above, the sender will be advised, and asked as to its disposal.
14. Parcels returned by request to another country will be surcharged with the ordinary Parcel Postage. Such surcharge, together with any other charges to which the parcel has become liable, will be collected

upon delivery, unless remitted by the sender, or the addressee returning the parcel.

15. Parcels re-directed to another country with which arrangements have been made for the exchange of Postal Parcels are, if the charges be not previously paid, subjected by the delivery office to a charge, to be paid by the addressees, representing the rate of postage from the office of re-direction to the place of delivery.

16. Parcels which cannot be delivered, or re-directed or returned to the sender, will be sent back to the country whence they came.

17. Queen Bees and live but harmless entomological specimens can be sent by Parcels Post to reciprocating countries, except the United Kingdom, Russia, and New South Wales, under the following Special Regulations:—Size of box or cage not to exceed 12 inches × 6 inches × 4 inches; each box or cage to bear a label securely attached, giving name and address of sender, and particulars of contents. Boxes, &c. posted in violation of these conditions, or containing poisonous or dangerous live specimens, or improperly or insecurely packed, will not be transmitted. Bee Bags having contents must not be enclosed in other bags, but must be sent separately, and care must be exercised in handling them, also to keep them from being covered by any other mail bags.

18. All Parcels must be handed to the proper officer in the Parcels Office, and not posted in the boxes for ordinary packets.

Direct Parcel Mails are made up for India, Ceylon, Germany, and Egypt.

#### REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSURANCE OF PARCELS.

1. Parcels for delivery in Tasmania, or addressed to New South Wales, South Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, or the United Kingdom, may be insured against Total Loss whilst in transmission through the post.

2. The sums payable for insurance, in addition to ordinary postage, are as follow:—

3. The fee for insurance must be prepaid by means of postage stamps, which the sender must affix to the parcel in prepayment of postage.

4. A certificate of insurance must always be obtained by the sender of an insured parcel. The necessary particulars must, as far as practicable, be inserted in the form of certificate by the sender or his representative. No charge will be made for the issue of such certificate.

5. No parcel may be insured for a sum in excess of the real value of the contents. An invoice or description of contents and the value of each article contained in the parcel must be enclosed therein. Over-insurance is a bar to compensation.

6. Parcels containing any of the following articles are *excluded from insurance*, viz.:—Liquids, or semi-liquids; perishable articles, such as eggs, butter, fruit, flowers, confectionery, &c.; fragile articles, such as glassware, &c. Under no circumstances will compensation be given for the loss of a parcel containing any of the above-mentioned articles.

7. Every parcel intended to be insured must be carefully and substantially packed, with due regard to the nature of the contents and the length of the journey, and must be secured in such a manner as to prevent tampering without leaving obvious traces of violation.

8. Parcels containing watches, jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, must be enclosed in strong boxes or cases, which must be securely fastened in wrappers of linen, canvas, strong paper, or other substantial material.

9. If a parcel tendered for insurance does not, in the opinion of the officer to whom it is tendered, fulfil the foregoing conditions as to packing and fastening, it is his duty to refuse to insure it; but the onus of properly packing and fastening the parcel lies upon the sender, and the Postmaster-General assumes no liability for loss arising from defects of packing or fastening which may not be observed at the time of posting.

10. Unless parcels containing watches, jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, be insured for at least part of their value, they cannot be sent by parcel post to the United Kingdom. Any such parcels addressed to the United Kingdom posted uninsured will, if practicable, be returned to the sender on payment of a fee of 6d. per parcel. A fee of 6d. will be collected on the delivery of every uninsured parcel

received from the United Kingdom, and found to contain watches, jewellery, or any article of gold or silver.

11. When an insured parcel is re-directed from one country or colony to another, a fresh insurance fee becomes payable for each such transmission. If this fee be not prepaid, it will be collected before delivery of the parcel. Insured parcels can be re-directed only to places within Tasmania, or to other Australian Colonies mentioned above, or the United Kingdom.

12. Compensation for a parcel lost in the post will not exceed the amount of the actual loss; but no compensation will be paid for a parcel containing any prohibited article, or which has been delivered without external trace of injury, and has been accepted without remark by the addressee, nor when loss arises from flood, tempest, shipwreck, earthquake, war, or other causes beyond control.

13. No application for compensation will be entertained unless made within three (3) months from date of posting of an inland or inter-colonial parcel, or within six (6) months from the date of posting of a parcel addressed to the United Kingdom. Such application may be made to the Postal Administration of either country or colony of origin or delivery, but the certificate of posting and insurance must be produced when required.

14. No legal liability to give compensation in respect of any parcel for which an insurance fee has been paid attaches to the Postmaster-General, either personally or in his official capacity. The final decision upon all questions of compensation rests with the Postal Administration of the country or colony in which the loss has taken place.

15. Any insurance effected contrary to the foregoing provisions is invalid.

#### General.

16. Where not repugnant to the foregoing Rules, the general Regulations relating to uninsured parcels apply also to insured parcels.

### INTERCOLONIAL, BRITISH, AND FOREIGN PARCELS POST.

PARCELS will be accepted for transmission to the undermentioned places, subject to the general regulations relating to Foreign Parcels Post, except where such regulations may be opposed to the special conditions given in the following Table, in which case the latter must be observed. No parcel will be accepted for a greater weight than that for which postage is shown in the Table.

NOTE.—Parcels from Places beyond Tasmania.—Parcels sent from London, or *via* London, are not transmitted by the same route as ordinary correspondence, but are shipped in England and brought in the vessels to Melbourne and thence to Hobart or Launceston, consequently they are not due in Tasmania until at least a week after arrival of letters dispatched same time. Parcels from India are not sent overland from Adelaide, as is the case with letters, but are in like manner brought in the ships to Melbourne and thence to Tasmania. Letters found in parcels will, according to Regulation 10, be taxed letter rate as from office of despatch, together with a fine equal to the amount of postage.



## PENALTIES FOR CERTAIN OFFENCES.

(Extracts from "The Post Office Act, 1881.")

Sender of a packet found to contain writing or any other article than the articles described to be contained therein is liable to a penalty not exceeding £10. (Sec. 17.)

Any Manager, Secretary, or Actuary of any Savings Bank, Building Society, or Registered Friendly Society who receives any packet containing any other articles or communication other than money, deposit-book, or communication relating to the deposit or repayment of money in such Savings Bank, Building Society, or Registered Friendly Society, and who fails to exhibit such packet or its contents to the nearest Postmaster, and pay out of the funds of the depositor the letter rate of postage chargeable on such packet, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. (Sec. 18.)

If any person wilfully or knowingly sends to or puts into, or causes to be sent or put into, any Post Office any newspaper which, or the cover whereof, contains any printing, writing, or thing whatsoever therein or thereon other than the contents of such newspaper as printed by the publisher thereof, other than the direction thereof and the name and address of the sender, shall for any such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. (Sec. 21.)

If any person wilfully or knowingly puts into or sends to, or causes to be sent to or put into, any Post Office any letter, packet, or newspaper containing any article or thing injurious or likely to be injurious to the contents of the mail or to any person, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50. (Sec. 25.)

If any person authorised to frank letters, &c. franks any letter or packet which is not *bonâ fide* on the public service only, he shall for every such offence incur a penalty not exceeding £10. (Sec. 27.)

Whoever sells or attempts to sell any postage stamp or postage-stamps made under the authority of the Post Office Act without being duly authorised in that behalf by the Postmaster-General, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. (Sec. 29.)

If any person authorised to sell stamps fraudulently demands or obtains as payment for such stamps a greater value than the value denoted upon the stamp or stamps in respect of which such greater value shall have been demanded or obtained, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Three years. (Sec. 30.)

Any person who fraudulently forges or imitates, or assists in forging or imitating, any stamp made under the authority of the Post Office Act, or offers, utters, disposes of, or puts off any forgery or imitation of any such stamp with intent to defraud, shall be guilty of felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Seven years. (Sec. 31.)

Any person who wilfully and with intent to defraud removes from any stamp which has been previously used any mark made thereon by any Post Office to show that such stamp has been previously used, or sells or uses such stamp with intent to defraud, shall be guilty of a

misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three years. (Sec. 35.)

All ship mails, letters, packets, or newspapers arriving at any place within this Colony shall be immediately delivered to the Harbour Master or Officer of the Post Office; any person failing in this respect is liable to a penalty of £20. (Sec. 53.)

The Master of every vessel is required on arrival to make a Declaration that all mails, &c. have been delivered; any person failing to make such Declaration, or making a false Declaration, is liable to a penalty of £20. (Sec. 54.)

If the Master of a vessel refuses or neglects to receive any mail on board such vessel upon request of the Harbour Master or officer of the Post Office, or to give a receipt for the mail, or to deposit such mail in some secure and dry place on board such vessel, such Master shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £100. (Sec. 55.)

Masters of vessels are required to give to the Post Office authorities immediate notice of the arrival of such vessel, and shall also give Twenty-four hours' notice of the vessel's intended departure; any failure in this respect will render such Master liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 56.)

All vessels by which mails are conveyed are required to provide a suitable locker or other secure place in which such mails shall be carried; and if the mails are carried in any such vessel otherwise than aforesaid, the Master will for each offence be liable to a penalty of £25. (Sec. 57.)

If any person duly authorised to receive or dispatch mails fails or neglects such duty, or retards the delivery of any mail, letter, packet, or newspaper, he shall for each offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50. (Sec. 58.)

If any party to a contract with the Postmaster-General for conveyance of mails by sea during the continuance thereof refuses, neglects, or omits to comply with any stipulation or provision contained therein, every such party shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50, irrespective of any penalty recoverable for such default by virtue of any bond into which any such party or his sureties may have entered for the due performance of such contract. (Sec. 60.)

If any person not employed by the Post Office carries for hire any letter, such person shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20. (Sec. 61.)

Any person employed under or in the carrying out the provisions of the Post Office Act who steals or for any purpose whatever embezzles, secretes, or destroys any posted letter, packet, or newspaper, is guilty of felony, and on conviction thereof is liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Eight years; and if such letter or packet stolen or embezzled, secreted, or destroyed contains therein any valuable security, money, or chattel, such offender shall be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Twenty years. (Sec. 89.)

Any person who steals from or out of a posted letter or packet any chattel, money, or valuable security shall be guilty of felony, and on conviction will be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Twenty years. (Sec. 90.)

Any person stealing any bag, box, or package of letters, packets, or

newspapers is liable to be imprisoned for a term of Twenty years. (Sec. 91.)

Any person who steals any posted letter, &c., from any mail-bag, &c., or from any person employed under this Act, or who unlawfully opens any bag, &c., containing posted letters, &c., is liable to be imprisoned for a term of Eight years. (Sec. 92.)

Any person who receives any posted letter, packet, or newspaper, or any bag, &c., containing posted letters, &c., knowing the same to have been stolen, shall be guilty of felony, and may be tried and convicted either as an accessory after the fact or for a substantive felony, and in the latter case is liable to imprisonment for Twenty years. (Sec. 93.)

Any person who unlawfully issues any money order with a fraudulent intent is liable on conviction to imprisonment for Five years. (Sec. 94.)

In the case of every felony punishable under the Post Office Act, every principal in the second degree, and every accessory before the fact, shall be punishable in the same manner as the principal in the first degree, and every accessory after the fact (except only a receiver) shall, on conviction, be liable to imprisonment for Two years. (Sec. 96.)

Any person who solicits or endeavours to procure any other person to commit a felony punishable under the Post Office Act is liable to imprisonment for Two years. (Sec. 97.)

If any person employed under the Post Office Act fails, refuses, neglects, or omits to comply with or fulfil any of the provisions of that Act, such person shall for any such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50. (Sec. 98.)

If the driver of any mail coach or other vehicle or any person in charge of any mail loiters on the road or wilfully misspends or loses time, thus retarding delivery of such mail, such person is liable to a penalty of £5. (Sec. 99.)

Any person wilfully obstructing or retarding the conveyance of any mail is liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 100.)

If any person employed in carrying a mail loses the same whilst in his charge, whether such mail is recovered or not, he shall be liable to a penalty of £25. (Sec. 101.)

Any person who fraudulently retains or wilfully secretes, keeps, or detains, or who, after demand is made by an officer of the Post Office, neglects or refuses to deliver up any letter or packet forwarded by post which has been wrongfully delivered and which is in the custody of such person, is liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 102.)

If any person opens or permits to be opened, detained, or delayed (except as allowed by the Post Office Act) any letter or packet after the same has been delivered into any Post Office or into the house of any person employed under the said Act, without the authority of the person to whom such letter or packet is addressed, he shall be liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 103.)

Any person destroying the property of the Post Office, or assisting to destroy such property, is liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 104.)

Any disorderly person loitering or stopping opposite to or on the premises of a Post Office is liable to a penalty of £5. (Sec. 105.)

Any person unlawfully entering any Post Office, or upon the premises belonging or attached to any Post Office, is liable to a penalty of £5. (Sec. 106.)

Any person who puts into any Post Office any letter, packet, or newspaper bearing an obscene, profane, or libellous address or signature, is liable to a penalty of £50. (Sec. 107.)

# ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

## REGULATIONS.

1. All telegrams must be written distinctly with ink, on forms provided for that purpose, the signature of the sender in each case being required in authentication of the message; but all telegrams, whether written on the proper form or on plain paper, will be considered as presented for transmission under the conditions contained in the following regulations. Telegrams indecently or obscenely worded, or appearing to contain libellous or grossly offensive matter, or which may seem to be contrary to the laws of the State, will not be transmitted.

2. In order to prevent errors in the transmission of telegrams, all words must be written in full, and no abbreviations will be allowed that are not in general use, and in accordance with the usage of the language. All numbers must be written in words in full, and not in figures, in the text of messages, and must be so signalled, with the exception of Press messages, messages on Her Majesty's service, and to and from the British Naval authorities on the Australian Station.

3. As a general rule all messages must be prepaid, except in the case of replies to messages on which the words "reply paid" have been written, or where special arrangements have been made for payment by receiver; but in all cases the sender will be held responsible for the cost of the message should payment be refused by addressee.

4. Messages will be delivered free within one mile of the office. For greater distances, portage, or, where necessary, cab or boat hire will be charged, and must be prepaid or guaranteed. Where a special messenger has to be employed the department will make the best arrangements it can, but the telegram will only be so forwarded at the sender's risk and cost, and should no messenger be procurable the telegram will be posted at the option of the sender.

5. Every Inland and Intercolonial message consisting wholly or in part of words in secret language, or of words in any admitted language (French, German, Italian, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, and Latin), having no connective meaning, or groups of letters, shall be regarded as a cipher message, and every cipher word in such message shall be counted as two words, and the extra charge added to the minimum rate for a message, provided that such extra charge shall not in any case exceed 50 per cent. on the ordinary rate which would be payable on account of the said telegram. Isolated letters or groups of letters having no connective meaning to be charged at the rate of one word for each letter. Any English dictionary word not exceeding 15 letters will not be taxed at cipher rate, except to West Australia, to which Colony cipher rate is charged.

6. To facilitate delivery, care should be taken to give full name and address of person to whom the telegram is addressed.

7. The sender of any telegram can have the telegram repeated back to him by the office to which the message is addressed on payment of an additional half-rate.

8. The Government will not be responsible for mistakes in the transmission of messages, from whatever cause they may arise, nor for any delay in the transmission and delivery, nor for non-transmission or non-delivery of any message.

9. Except in cases of emergency, illness, &c., or messages on the service of the State, or urgent messages on which double rates have been paid, messages will be transmitted in the order in which they are received. No person shall be entitled to the use of any telegraph line for transmission of any telegram or telegrams, not being Press messages, for more than half an hour. In the case of Press telegrams, the limit during the day (from 8.30 A.M. until 8 P.M.) will be five hundred (500) words.

10. Urgent telegrams or messages, on which double the usual rate has been paid by the sender, are to have priority of transmission over all other telegrams.

11. In the event of any interruption or accident to the lines which may prevent the transmission of any telegram within a reasonable time, or may destroy the value of such telegram, notice thereof will, where practicable, be sent to the sender of the telegram, who will have the option of withdrawing his telegram and receiving back the amount paid thereon, on application to the Superintendent of Telegraphs, through the officer in charge of the station at which such telegram was presented.

12. Applications for refund, except in cases specified in the preceding regulation, must be made in writing, addressed to the Superintendent of Telegraphs, stating reasons why the application is made.

13. Any telegram lodged in Tasmania for delivery within the Colony may be cancelled at the request of the sender, provided delivery has not been effected. In the event of the telegram not having been transmitted the fee shall be returned, but if it has been transmitted no refund shall be made; a service telegram will, however, be sent to the office of address, if desired, at the cost of the sender, to stop delivery. Should such service telegram arrive too late the fact will, if practicable, be communicated to the sender of the original message, but the cost of the service telegram will not be repaid.

14. The receiver of a message may have the whole or part of it repeated on payment of the cost of the telegram demanding the repetition, and of the reply to the same. The sender can also have the whole or any portion of his message repeated on payment of the cost of the telegram he forwards and of the reply. The demand for the repetition must be made within seventy-two hours after receipt or despatch of the telegram.

15. At the request of the sender or receiver a telegram may be redirected and transmitted to another station, but if it has already been transmitted to the original address it will be subject to an additional rate.

16. No application for copies of messages after delivery will be entertained unless at the request of the sender or the addressee; and in all cases the Superintendent will require satisfactory reasons for the application. A search fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each telegram must accompany the application, and should the telegram have to be transmitted to another station one-half the usual rates will be charged for such transmission in addition to the above fee.

17. The strictest secrecy as to the contents or purport of any message is enjoined; no person not employed in the service of the Telegraph Department is allowed access to the operating-rooms without a special order from the Superintendent; and any officer of the department allowing any person to enter the operating rooms, or affording any information as to the contents or purport of any message, except under the preceding regulation, will render himself liable to the penalties specified in the Telegraph Act.

18. Telegrams will be kept in the custody of the Superintendent of Telegraphs for the space of one year, after which they will be burned or destroyed, by direction of the superintendent, in the presence of some duly authorised officer.

19. Messages upon which all fees payable in Tasmania have been paid may be transmitted by post as letters for delivery in Tasmania or in any of the Australian colonies, or New Zealand, without any extra payment for postage; the sender must, however, write the words "To be posted from ——" under the address. Surnames are not registered as code addresses.

20. Code Addresses are registered at the General Post Office, Hobart, with record of full address at which telegrams bearing abbreviated or arbitrary addresses are to be delivered. The fee for registration is Ten Shillings and Sixpence per annum, or Two Shillings and Sixpence for one month for every address registered.

21. The fees on all telegrams for transmission, presented at offices throughout Tasmania, must be paid by means of stamps affixed thereto. In every case the smallest number of stamps that will denote the charge must be used.

22. Any person wishing to use the telegraph to or from any station in Tasmania after closing hours, can do so on giving notice to the Postmaster before 4 P.M., stating at what time the line will be required, and depositing the sum of five shillings, which will be retained should no message be sent. If the use of the line is required on Sunday, notice must be given on Saturday before 4 P.M. The deposit of five shillings will cover the transmission of a single message not exceeding ten words, the ordinary rate being charged after the first ten words and on all other messages. Should it be desired to keep the operators in attendance, a further charge of one shilling per hour after the first hour will be made for each officer, ordinary rates being charged for messages.

## INTERNATIONAL TELEGRAMS.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ACCEPTANCE AND TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS.

1. The Main Lines of the various Telegraph Companies have continuous service; the Chief Offices are always open, but some of the branch offices have day service only, and limited service on Sundays.

2. Telegrams are accepted by the Telegraph Companies subject to the conditions printed hereunder, and also to the rules and regulations of the International Telegraph Convention, including Article 3, which stipulates that the Telegraph Administrations accept no responsibility on account of their respective services.

The following notice is issued to the public by the Eastern Extension Australasia and China Telegraph Company, Limited:—"The public are informed that messages will only be received conditionally that no responsibility attaches to the Administration for delay in transmission or delivery or for non-transmission or non-delivery, or for mistakes, from whatever cause they may arise. In order to provide against errors in transmission of important telegrams, every message of consequence ought to be repeated by being sent back from the station at which it is to be received to the station from which it is originally sent. One-quarter the usual price for transmission will be charged for such transmission."

*Manner of Writing and Acceptance of Telegrams.*

3. In order to guard against mistakes, attention is called to the great importance of legible writing.

4. Telegrams may be composed of plain language, or of secret language, *i.e.*, of code words, or of figures or groups of figures, each of which may be employed alone or conjointly with the others in the same telegram. Some countries do not admit telegrams in secret language.

5. Telegrams in plain language must present a clear meaning in any one or several of the languages admitted for telegraphic correspondence.

6. Telegrams in code must consist of words, each of them presenting a clear meaning, but not forming intelligible phrases.

7. Code words must not exceed *ten letters in length*, according to the Morse alphabet, taken from one or several of the following languages:—English, French, German, Italian, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, and Latin. No other languages can be used.

8. Proper names which are not found in the Official Vocabulary can only appear in the text of code telegrams when used in their natural sense.\*

9. The Office at which the telegram is tendered for transmission may call for the production of the code in order to ascertain whether the rules laid down in the two preceding paragraphs have been adhered to.

\* From a date to be fixed by a future Telegraph Conference all private code telegrams may contain only words to be found in the augmented Official Vocabulary prepared by the International Bureau of the Telegraph Administration.

10. Telegrams in cipher may only be composed of Arabic figures, or groups of Arabic figures, but the employment of letters or groups of letters having a secret meaning is not allowed in private telegrams.

11. The following conventional signs are counted as one word :—

(D)	...	Urgent.
(RP)	...	Reply paid.
(RPx)	...	Reply paid x words.
(RPD)	...	Reply paid urgent.
(RPDx)	...	Reply paid urgent x words.
(TC)	...	Collated.

12. The telegram to be transmitted must be legibly written in characters which have their equivalents in the official table of telegraph signals.

These characters are as follows :—

#### Letters :

A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U,  
V, W, X, Y, Z.

Ä, Á, Â, É, Ñ, Ö, Ü.

#### Figures :

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 0.

#### Signs of punctuation, &c. :

Full stop (.), comma (,), semicolon (;), colon (:), note of interrogation (?), note of exclamation (!), apostrophe ('), hyphen (-), parentheses ( ), inverted commas (" ), bar of division (/), underline (—).

13. Every interlineation, reference, erasure, or alteration must be authenticated by the sender or his representative.

14. The different parts forming the telegram must be written in the following order :—

1. Special instructions; 2. Address; 3. Text; 4. Signature.

15. Any instructions the Sender may have to give as to the delivery at destination, prepayment of reply, acknowledgment of receipt, repetition (collationnement), extra copies, &c., should be written immedi-

ately before the address of the telegram, and are charged for. These notices may be written in the abbreviated form adopted for official instructions, as given in paragraph 11.

16. The address of a Telegram must consist of at least two words, the first representing the name and address of the Receiver, and the second the name of the telegraph office of destination. These words must be inserted and charged for as part of the telegram. The consequences of an incomplete or incorrect address must be borne by the Sender. When the name of the terminal office is not in the official list of stations issued by the International Bureau at Berne, the name of the country of destination must be inserted.

17. The Companies will, at their own Stations and free of charge, accord to the receivers of telegrams the privilege of having their telegrams addressed to them in a preconcerted or abbreviated form, if application is made to the Station where it is desired to register such address, and if the conditions laid down by the Companies for such arrangements have previously been complied with. An address may thus be given in two words, as "Beranger London." Only one address, however, can be allowed for each correspondent. When a telegram is addressed to the care of a person who has registered an address, his name or the words representing the registered address must be preceded by one of the instructions "Care of" (Chez) or "C/o."

18. In all cases where it is desired to register a code address, a proper name or a dictionary word must be chosen after consultation with the receiving office.

Such combinations as "Cornmart" for "Cornelius Mart," "Granotel" for "Grand Hotel," &c., being neither proper names nor dictionary words, cannot be accepted for registration, nor can such irregular combinations be admitted in the text of telegrams.

19. At places where the Companies do not deliver telegrams to the public, the application for registration must be made to the local Telegraph Authorities, some of whom make a charge for such registration.

20. These registrations apply, however, only to telegrams received at the station where the registration is effected, and not to telegrams forwarded from such Station. Registration must in every case be effected at the Receiving Station.

21. The text of a telegram may be omitted.

22. The Sender or his Representative must sign the telegram at the foot of the telegram form, adding, if required, his address, but the name of the Sender is only charged for if transmitted.

23. The Sender of a private telegram is bound to prove his identity when requested to do so. The Sender may have his signature legalised, and include such legalisation in his telegram. The number of words required for this purpose must be paid for.

#### Rectifying Telegrams.

24. The Receiver of a telegram may have the whole or part of it repeated, on payment of the cost of the telegram demanding the repetition, and of the reply to the same. These telegrams are exchanged between the telegraph offices concerned, and not between the sender and receiver.

25. The demand for the repetition must be made within seventy-two hours (not including Sundays) after receipt or despatch of the telegram, and should be written in the following manner :—

“S.R. Calcutta from London” (*these words are not charged for*).

“Twenty-sixth” (*date of original telegram*), “Brown” (*addressee of original telegram*), “Repeat first, fourth, ninth” (*meaning text words in the original telegram*); or,

“Twenty-sixth,” “Brown” “Repeat word” (*or words*) “after \_\_\_\_\_.”

The reply will be as follows :—

“S.R. London from Calcutta” (*these words are not charged for*).

“Brown”.....(*words repeated*).

26. The number of words in the reply will thus exceed by one the number of words to be repeated.

*Between stations supplied with the “Repetition Code Book” the repetition and reply may be sent in the form therein indicated.*

27. The charges will be refunded if the repetition proves that the original telegram has been mutilated in transmission.

28. In case some of the words repeated are shown to have been correctly transmitted, the cost of the words employed to obtain the repetition of the same, both in the telegram of inquiry and reply, will be retained.

29. No refund will be made when the mutilation has been caused by illegible handwriting on the part of the Sender, or when the repetition is obtained direct instead of by means of an official service telegram.

30. No reimbursement of the charge for the original telegram will be allowed.

31. The Sender can also have the whole or any portion of his telegram repeated, corrected, or amplified on payment of the cost of the telegram he forwards and of the reply, if one be required.

32. The repetition takes the following form :—

#### EXAMPLE OF A RECTIFYING TELEGRAM SENT BY THE SENDER.

“S.T. Paris from London 26” (*No. of the service taxé*) “8” (*No. of words*) (*These particulars are not charged for*) “235 thirteenth Krichbaum” (*No., date and Name of Receiver of Telegram to be rectified*) “Replace third” (*word of text*) “20 by 200” (*correction*).

The charges paid for this class of telegram are not refunded, except when they are necessitated by errors of the Telegraph Service.

#### Counting and Charging.

33. All telegrams are charged according to a tariff per word.

34. All that the Sender writes on the telegram form for transmission to his correspondent is charged for.

35. In European telegrams signs of punctuation, apostrophes, hyphens, and fresh paragraphs are not charged for. These signs are not transmitted in extra-European telegrams unless paid for.

36. The name of the Station of origin, the date, and time deposited will be officially inserted in the message, and supplied to the Receiver free of charge. Telegrams from North America, *via* the North Atlantic, bear the London time, the original time not being signalled by the North Atlantic Companies.

37. Combinations or alterations of words contrary to the usage of the language are not admitted.

38. Nevertheless, names of towns and countries; patronymics belonging to one person; names of places, squares, boulevards, or streets; names of ships; whole or fractional numbers written entirely in letters; and English and French compound words (to be found in a standard dictionary), joined by a hyphen or separated by an apostrophe are counted as one word if so written, subject to the limitation of letters in paragraphs 41–42.

39. If a short charge has been made on a telegram owing to the Sender having employed words or combinations contrary to the usage of the language, the amount short charged will be collected from the Receiver. The telegram will only be delivered on the payment of such short charge.

40. The following are counted as one word in all languages :—

1st. In the address (not in the text of the telegram):

- a. The name of the telegraph office of destination written as it appears in the *first column* of the official nomenclature of the offices, even when this name is followed by that of the country or of the territorial subdivision to which such office belongs.
- b. The names of countries or territorial subdivisions respectively, if written in conformity with the said nomenclature.

2nd. Every separate character, letter or figure.

3rd. Underline.

4th. Parenthesis (the two signs which serve to form it).

5th. Inverted commas (the two signs placed at the commencement and end of one and the same passage).

6th. Supplementary instructions written in the abridged form admitted by paragraph 11.

41. In telegrams written entirely in plain language the maximum length of a word is fixed at fifteen letters, any additional letters being counted and charged for as extra words, at the rate of fifteen letters to the word.

42. In Code language the maximum length of a word is fixed at ten letters. Words in plain language inserted in the text of a mixed telegram, *i.e.*, composed of words in plain language and code, are each counted at the rate of ten letters to a word. If the mixed telegram contains in addition, cipher language, the counting of that part is regulated by paragraph 45.

43. In Cipher telegrams the figures are counted at the rate of five to a word, and words in plain language at the rate of fifteen letters to the word.

44. Words joined by a hyphen or separated by an apostrophe are counted as so many separate words.

45. Each group of five figures or less is charged for as one word; larger groups are charged at the rate of five figures to a word. The same rule applies to the counting of letters when admitted.

46. Decimal points, commas, hyphens, bars of division, stops used in the formation of numbers or trade marks are each counted as a figure, or a letter in the group or trade mark in which they occur. The same

rule applies to letters added to figures *to form ordinal numbers*. With this exception groups of figures and letters combined are not admitted.

47. Code words containing more than ten letters (if inadvertently admitted), and words not belonging to any of the languages admitted for international correspondence, are charged for at the rate of five letters to the word.

48. The words "fob" (meaning "free on board,"), "cif" ("cost insurance freight,"), and "cfi" ("cost freight insurance") are accepted as one word if written together. If written separately as "F.O.B.," "C.I.F.," and "C.F.I.," they are counted as three words each. The abbreviations "B/L" ("Bill of Lading,"), "c/o" ("care of"), and "o/o" ("per cent.") are each accepted as one word.

49. The words twopence, threepence, up to elevenpence, if written together, are charged as one word each. In a code or mixed telegram, however, the words elevenpence is charged as two words, as it contains over ten letters; in a cipher telegram it counts as one word only.

50. The following are examples for counting and charging Telegrams :—

#### Payment of Charges.

51. Telegrams are, so far as concerns the application of charges and of certain service regulations, subject either to the European *regime* or to the extra-European *regime*.

52. The European *regime* comprises all the countries of Europe, as well as Algiers, Tunisia, Tripoli, Russia in Caucasus, Turkey in Asia, Azores, Senegal, the coast of Morocco, and other countries situated outside Europe which are declared by the respective Administrations to belong to this *regime*.

53. The extra-European *regime* comprises all the countries not included in the preceding paragraph.

54. All charges must be prepaid, except those for supplementary services or special conveyance beyond the Telegraph Office of destination, which are claimed from the Addressee.

55. A receipt will be given, free of charge, for every telegram handed in at any of the Companies' stations.

56. A receipt can also be obtained for any telegram handed in at any Government Telegraph Station, for which a small charge is sometimes made.

57. Short charges and charges due by the Addressee, which are not recovered from him, are to be paid by the Sender.

58. Charges erroneously collected in excess are returned.

#### Stoppage of Telegrams.

59. Any Sender can, by proving his identity, stop, if in time, the transmission of a telegram deposited by him.

60. The Telegraph Administrations reserve to themselves the power to stop the transmission of any private telegram which may appear dangerous to the security of the State or which may be contrary to the laws of the Country or to public order or decency. If such power is exercised the sender is advised thereof.

#### Delivery at Destination.

61. Telegrams are delivered according to their address, at the place of residence of the Receiver, or *poste restante* at the Post Office, or *Telegraph restante* at the Telegraph Office, and in the two latter cases they are only delivered to the Receiver or to a person duly appointed by him.

62. A Telegram taken to the place of residence may be delivered either to the Receiver, the adult members of his family, to his employés, lodgers, or landlord, or to the porter of the house, unless the Receiver has given special instructions to the contrary.

63. If the door is not opened at the address given, or if the messenger finds no one who will consent to take in the telegram, notice is left at the address given and the telegram is brought back to the Telegraph Office to be delivered to the Receiver upon his application.

64. When a telegram cannot be delivered, the delivery office advises the sending office of the cause of non-delivery, which advice, if practicable, is communicated to the Sender. The latter can only complete, rectify, or confirm the address by a paid telegram.

#### Urgent Telegrams.

65. Some Governments accept Urgent Telegrams, which take precedence of all other private telegrams and are charged triple rates. At Offices in Countries the Governments of which accept Urgent Telegrams, the Companies also accept this class of telegram, subject to the same regulations as to transmission and charging.

#### Prepaid Replies.

66. The Sender may prepay a reply to his telegram, which must not, however, exceed thirty words, unless it be to obtain the repetition of a telegram previously transmitted, under Rules 24 and 31.

67. The words "reply prepaid" or "(RP)" are to be written before the address and paid for, and the Sender must state the number of words he has prepaid; for instance, "reply prepaid twenty" or "(RP 20)"; the first instructions counting as 3 and the latter as 1 word. If the Sender does not specify the number of words for which he pre-pays a reply, charge is made for an ordinary telegram of 10 words.

68. The amount prepaid by the Sender is held at the disposal of the Receiver for a period of six weeks.

69. Should such reply or other telegram contain more words than have been prepaid, the excess must be paid for by the Sender of the reply.

70. If the original telegram be refused by the Addressee, the delivery office will inform the Sender of it by a service notice, which takes the place of the reply. If the Addressee of the original telegram cannot be found, the amount deposited for the reply will be refunded to the sender, if claimed.

71. If the Receiver does not make use of the amount prepaid, he may, within a period of three months, return the voucher delivered with the original telegram, and request that the money be refunded to the sender. If the reply be sent and contain a less number of words than have been prepaid, the difference will be returned to the sender, if applied for, in the case of extra-European telegrams, but no return is made in the case of European telegrams.

#### *Repeated or Collated Telegrams.*

72. The Sender may have his telegram repeated from Station to Station on payment of an additional charge, equal to a quarter of the ordinary rate. The words "repetition paid," or the abbreviated signal "(TC)" must be written before the address, and charged for.

#### *Acknowledgment of Receipt.*

73. The Sender may request that the time at which his telegram is delivered to the Receiver be notified to him by telegraph or by post.

74. The words "acknowledgment paid" or the abbreviated signal "(PC)," or if by post "(PCP)," must be written before the address of the telegram, and charged for. The cost of an acknowledgment of receipt by telegraph is equal to that of a telegram of 10 words; for an acknowledgment by post the charge is 5*d.*

#### *Telegrams to follow.*

75. Telegrams can be directed to several addressees "to follow"—for instance, "(FS) John Brown, Hotel de Rome Berlin ou Römer, Frankfurt a/M." The Sender pays the charges to the first destination and the cost of further transmission is collected on delivering the telegram. The words "faire suivre" or the official Code (FS) must be inserted before the address, for which the rate of two words is charged in the former, and of one word in the latter case.

76. Replies to telegrams "to follow" cannot be prepaid, neither can an acknowledgment of receipt be obtained.

77. Telegrams to follow are not accepted by some countries out of Europe.

78. The receiver may also arrange with the telegraph office to have his telegrams re-directed on undertaking to pay all charges. In this case, the word "Re-expédié" will be inserted before the address by the re-directing telegraph office and charged for.

#### *Multiple Telegrams.*

79. Telegrams may be addressed—

a. To several persons in the same place.

b. To one person at several residences in the same place; if the words "X addresses" or (TMx)—the former counting as two and the latter as one word—be written before the address.

80. Telegrams addressed to several addressees, or to the same addressee, in different towns, are charged as so many separate telegrams.

81. Telegrams addressed to several persons in the same place, or to one person at several residences in the same place, with or without further despatch by post, are charged as single telegrams, plus a copying fee of 5*d.* (for urgent telegrams 10*d.*) for every 100 words or fraction of every 100 words contained in the telegram for every additional address after the first.

82. In calculating the charge for the telegram all the names and addresses are included in the number of chargeable words.

*Multiple Telegrams for places in North America are not accepted.*

#### *Telegrams to Places beyond the International System.*

83. Telegrams for places not connected by telegraph must have instructions inserted before the address as to the means by which they are to be forwarded to destination; for instance—

"Express (or post) Müller, Steglitz, Berlin."

84. The name of the telegraph office by which the telegram is to be sent on by post, express or other means, is stated last.

85. Telegrams to be sent by post to a country other than that of the terminal telegraph station are subject to a fee of 5*d.* The charges for transmission by express are, as a rule, collected from the receiver.

#### *Semaphoric Telegrams.*

86. Semaphoric telegrams are telegrams exchanged with ships at sea by means of semaphores established on the various coasts.

87. Semaphoric telegrams should be written either in the language of the country in which the signal station is situated, or in signals of the Universal Commercial Code. In the latter case they are considered as cipher telegrams.

88. The charge for a semaphoric telegram is tenpence in addition to the ordinary telegraphic charges. For telegrams signalled from ships at sea the charge is collected from the receiver.

#### *Certified Copies of Telegrams.*

89. The sender and receiver of a telegram, or their authorised representative, on proof of identity and on furnishing full particulars of the telegram, may obtain a certified copy of the telegram as handed in, or as delivered at destination, on payment of 5*d.* or 50 centimes for every 100 words or fraction of 100 words.

90. As all telegrams are destroyed periodically, certified copies of European telegrams more than six months old, and of extra-European telegrams more than twelve months old, cannot be supplied.

#### *Refunds.*

91. Claims may be made for refund in the following cases:—

a. The full cost of every telegram which has failed to reach its destination *through the fault of the telegraph service.*

b. The full cost of every telegram stopped in transmission owing to interruption, and cancelled by the sender.

- c. The full cost of every telegram which, owing to the fault of the telegraphic service, is received later than it would have been delivered by post, or has not been delivered to the receiver until after a delay of twenty-four hours if a telegram under the European *regime*, and 144 hours if a telegram under the extra-European *regime*; for countries under the European *regime*, but which do not form part of Europe, the period in question is raised to forty-eight hours.
  - d. The full cost of every repeated or collated telegram which has manifestly been unable to fulfil its object in consequence of errors made in its transmission, unless the errors have been rectified by paid service advice.
  - e. The supplementary charge for special services not rendered.
  - f. The full cost of every paid service advice, the sending of which has been necessitated by service error.
  - g. The amount deposited for a reply when the addressee has not been able to make use of the voucher, provided the sender claims within three months from the date of issue.
  - h. The charge in respect of the telegraph section not traversed by the telegram when, owing to interruption of a telegraph route, the telegram has been forwarded to its destination by postal or other means. The expense of replacing the original telegraphic route by any other means of transport is, however, deducted from the amount to be refunded.
  - i. The cost of every word omitted in transmission of a telegram of the extra-European *regime*, unless corrected by paid service advice.
  - j. Amounts deposited for paid service advices and for replies thereto, if the repetition does not agree with the first transmission, with the reservation, however, that when some words have been correctly and some incorrectly reproduced in the first telegram, the charge for words in the request for repetition and in the reply, relating exclusively to words correctly transmitted originally, is not refunded.
  - k. The difference between the amount of a reply voucher relating to an extra-European telegram and the charge for a reply telegram of less value prepaid by means of such voucher.
  - l. The charge for every telegram stopped under paragraph 59.
92. In the cases provided for in paragraphs *a, b, c, d, h, and i*, the refund only applies to the tariff of the actual telegrams lost, cancelled, delayed, or mutilated, including any supplementary charges not used, but not to telegrams necessitated or rendered useless by non-delivery, delay, or mutilation.
93. In case of a partial refund on account of a multiple telegram, the total charge received is divided by the number of copies, and the quotient represents the amount of refund for each copy, the telegram itself counting as one copy.
94. When errors of the telegraphic service have been corrected by paid service advices, reimbursement only applies to the charges for such service advices. No refund is made in respect of telegrams to which such advices relate.

95. No reimbursement is made for rectifying telegrams which, instead of being exchanged from office to office as paid service advices, have been exchanged direct between sender and receiver.

96. Every claim for refund should be made, under penalty of rejection, within three months for European and six months for extra-European telegrams from the date of deposit of the telegram.

97. Every claim must be made to the original sending Administration, and be accompanied by documentary evidence—i.e., a written statement from the terminal office or addressee if the telegram has been delayed or not been delivered; the copy delivered to the addressee, if the question is one of alteration or omission.

98. The claim may, however, be presented by the addressee to the office of destination, which decides whether it must deal with it, or whether it must be forwarded to the sending Administration.

## Charges for Press and Government Messages.

The rates for Press telegrams in plain English have been reduced over the Eastern Extension Company's cables. The rate from Tasmania to England for *bonâ fide* Press telegrams is 2s. 5d. per word.

The rates for Press telegrams to France have been reduced to 2s. 5d. per word. These messages must be in plain language and written in French.

The rates for Press messages to India and Burmah have been reduced to 2s. per word. To Ceylon, 2s. 1d. per word. To Straits Settlements, 1s. 10d. per word.

By "Press messages" are meant messages addressed to newspapers duly published in accordance with the respective laws relating to the publication of newspapers in force in the United Kingdom or the Colonies, and intended in good faith for publication in full in such newspapers, and shall include only such as are intelligible and written in English, in plain language, and without the use of cypher, code, or letters or words of concealed meaning. Groups of figures are accepted when used in their natural sense.

Conditions on which Press Telegrams, exchanged with the Colonies of Australasia, will be accepted at a Reduced Tariff.

1. The wires by the Eastern or Indo-European Companies routes of telegraph from London to India and thence by the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company's route to Australia shall be available to the press for the transmission at reduced rates between London, France, India, Burmah, or Ceylon, and Adelaide, of news or intelligence for publication in newspapers allowed by the British and Australian Governments respectively, to receive intelligence by telegraph at the reduced rate.

2. Such messages shall not interfere with the transmission of the ordinary message traffic, and in order to ensure this the transmission of



such news messages may be deferred or suspended, or interrupted, until any Government message or any Ordinary or Press messages at full rates that may be on hand shall have been transmitted and completed.

3. The working of the wire or wires shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the International Telegraph Convention.

4. No messages at the reduced rate shall be sent except for publication in such newspapers, and they must be written in plain English when addressed to British Stations, and in plain French when addressed to French Stations, so as to be intelligible to the transmitting offices. Messages containing news or information not for publication, or containing code words or words of concealed meaning, or groups of figures or ciphers, shall be paid for at the full tariff rates in force for Ordinary messages. Groups of figures are accepted when used in their natural sense.

5. The newspapers, their correspondents or agents, are required to address their messages to a newspaper office, which shall be prohibited from selling, distributing, or communicating such messages to clubs, exchanges, or newsrooms, or disposing of them for any purpose whatsoever, directly or indirectly, other than for publication in newspapers allowed by the British and Australian Governments to receive them.

6. Messages can only be accepted from the authorised correspondent of a newspaper, and the news sent in such messages must be duly published in the newspapers, or satisfactory reasons be given for non-publication, in the absence of which full rates will be chargeable.

7. The Administrations reserve to themselves the right to terminate the present arrangements, but will in such case announce their intentions twelve months beforehand.

8. The reduced rate will be distributable amongst the Administrations in such proportions as they may agree amongst themselves.

## CONDITIONS.

The control of the companies over the message shall be deemed to have entirely ceased for the purposes of these conditions at any point where, in the course of the transit of the message to its destination, it may be entrusted by the companies (and the companies shall have full power so to entrust the message) for further transmission by or through any system, service, or line of telegraph belonging to or worked by any administration or authority not controlled by the companies exclusively, although worked as part of or in connection with the telegraphic system or service of the companies.

## NOTICES.

International Code Vocabulary.—Copies of the International Code Vocabulary can now be obtained at the Hobart Central Telegraph Office. Price 10s. each.

A record is open at the Hobart Central Telegraph Office for the registration of the full address, at which foreign telegrams reaching Hobart and bearing abbreviated or arbitrary addresses are to be delivered. A fee of 10s. per annum, or 5s. for one month, is charged for registration.

Addresses may also be registered at any Government Telegraph Office in England or Scotland upon payment of one guinea to the Postmaster-General, London. This registration can be effected only at the telegraph station in the town where the firm is established, and not by letter from Australia to London, or *vice versa*, as different firms sometimes select the same code word.

The Eastern Telegraph Companies register names and addresses of telegraph correspondents free of charge at all their stations, and in London, at No. 11, Old Broad-street; No. 8, Leadenhall-street; and No. 3, Great Tower-street.

In future telegrams from North America will bear the date and time of the arrival of such telegrams in London. Recipients of messages from North America will therefore understand that in future the entry on the delivery form, "Original date and time," will be the date and time they reached London.

There is now a fortnightly mail by steamer between Aden and Mauritius.

## TELEPHONE REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER AUTHORITY OF

THE TELEPHONE ACT, 1882, 46 VICT. No. 5, SECT. 9.

## CENTRAL EXCHANGES.

*Hobart, Launceston, and Zeehan.*

1. *Commercial Subscribers* (places of business, medical and legal practitioners, &c.)—The annual subscription to a Central Telephone Exchange, for any distance not exceeding a mile, shall be £6, and for every additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof, 10s.

2. *Domestic Subscribers* (private houses at which no profession or business is carried on) may be connected with an Exchange at an annual rental of £4 10s. for the first mile, and 10s. for each additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof.

3. Each Subscriber as above will be provided with one set of instruments, comprising two telephone receivers, one transmitter, call-bell, battery, and a special wire connected with the Exchange to which he subscribes, enabling him to communicate with any other Subscriber to the same Exchange, or with any Subscriber attending at the Central Bureau.

4. *Central Exchange Extensions*.—Extension of Exchange lines under same Exchange number will be provided at the following annual rental:—

One mile or under (line only) .....	£3	0	0
Each additional $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile or under ....	0	10	0
Each Telephone .....	1	0	0

5. For all Exchange lines an approved guarantee for at least one year's rental is required before a new contract is entered into.

## SUBURBAN AND COUNTRY EXCHANGES

AND TRUNK LINE CONNECTION TO A CENTRAL EXCHANGE.

6. Suburban or Country Subscribers may be connected with a Local Office or Exchange at rates to be mutually agreed upon, but not less than £3 for first mile or under and 10s. for each additional quarter mile or fraction thereof, including instruments, and, where a trunk line is available thence to a Central Exchange, at rates to be fixed by Postmaster-General. This will enable Subscribers to call up any Subscriber to the Exchange to which they are connected, and payment of an additional £3 per annum will entitle a Country Subscriber to be called up by any Central or Suburban Subscriber connected with the same Exchange.

7. If trunk line is required for other business, each connection will be limited to three minutes, and will be made in order of priority of application.

8. Subscribers may communicate after local office hours on giving due notice and payment of Five Shillings for every connection of ten minutes or fraction thereof.

*Private Lines.*

9. Private lines will be erected on terms to be mutually agreed upon, but at not less than £1 10s., per mile and Seven Shillings and Sixpence for each additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof. As a rule, the agreement must be for a period of three years, and will be terminable at any time after the end of that period on giving three months' notice.

10. The renter of a private line may provide his own apparatus and instruments, or the Government will provide and maintain apparatus and instruments at an annual charge of £1, to be paid in advance, for each set of apparatus or instruments, comprising two telephone receivers, one transmitter, call-bell, and battery.

11. The above rates to be charged on all Exchange Lines up to two miles and all Private Lines up to three miles; beyond that distance the extension may be charged at rates mutually agreed upon, but not less than 10s. per mile or fraction thereof.

*Telephone Bureaux.*

12. Telephone Bureaux have been established for use of the public by which a person can speak to any subscriber during office hours on payment of Sixpence for each five minutes or fraction if within a radius of six miles. Beyond that distance the charge will be One Shilling for each five minutes or fraction. Communication between subscribers and persons at the Exchange or Bureaux will as a rule be limited to five minutes at any one time.

**GENERAL REGULATIONS.**

13. Radial distance will be charged on Central Exchange lines only. For all other lines, whether Exchange Extension, Suburban, Country, or Private Lines, the length of the line will be determined by the shortest ordinary public road route.

14. Subscribers to an Exchange may forward a telegraphic message by telephone to such Exchange for transmission onward, on condition that a written copy of such message, with the amount payable thereon, is forwarded to the Telegraph Office before noon next day together with a fee of Threepence (3d.) for each message telephoned.

15. The Rules and Regulations of the 1st June, 1895, now in force, relating to telegraphic messages shall, where applicable, apply to telephonic messages.

16. Subscribers to an Exchange are allowed to have their names recorded once in the Telephone List free of charge, but in the event of more than one name being required to be inserted by a subscriber, an annual fee of Five Shillings (5s.) is to be charged for each additional name. Before, however, any additional names can be inserted in the List, evidence must be produced to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that the subscriber is acting as agent for the person or firm whose name he desires to be inserted, and in no case will anyone but the subscriber be allowed to use the telephone on behalf of such person or firm.

17. Persons occupying offices in the same building can jointly subscribe to a Telephone Exchange under the same Exchange number on paying, in addition to one ordinary subscription, £2 a year for each additional name to be inserted on the List of Subscribers.

18. Telephone Rentals must be paid in advance either yearly or half-yearly, at the option of the renter. Payments must be made within fourteen days of the date of demand, otherwise the telephone will be removed without further notice.

19. The renter of any line will at all times be liable for the cost of repairing any damage to instruments, &c. beyond ordinary wear and tear; and should he change his office or residence he will be required to pay such a portion of the cost of altering the line, &c. as may be determined by the Superintendent of Telegraphs.

20. The renter of any line will not be allowed to use such line for other than his own business. Any breach of this rule will involve the removal of the line and instruments, without prejudice to the right of the Government to claim the rent for the remainder of the term.

21. Extra fittings supplied after 1st January, 1897, will be charged at following rates per annum:—

**INSTRUCTIONS RESPECTING THE WORKING OF THE TELEPHONE EXCHANGES.****1. TO RING UP.**

Give one or two brisk turns to the handle, and immediately take the Telephone off the hook and place it firmly against the ear.

On hearing Exchange reply, give **NUMBER** and **NAME** required distinctly, thus:—"One nine six, William Smith."

Keep Telephone to your ear till you hear reply from the number wanted, when you should respond with your name and begin conversation.

**2. TO ANSWER.**

When rung up, **DO NOT RING BACK**, but take the Telephone off the hook immediately, place it firmly against the ear, and speak into the transmitter, giving your number and name.

**3. TO RING OFF.**

When the conversation is ended, hang the Telephone on the hook and give one or two brisk turns to the handle.

**EXPLANATION OF FOREGOING RULES.**

The first ring will drop a shutter at the Exchange and call the attendant, who will immediately connect the Telephone and answer the call by saying "Central Exchange" (or name of other Exchange, as the case may be).



The number and name of the Subscriber required should then be given, which the attendant will repeat and immediately ring up that number and connect you, and leave you connected.

The second Subscriber, hearing the ring, will immediately take the Telephone off the hook and answer you by giving his number and name, when the conversation will proceed.

When finished, the "ring off" will drop as a special shutter at the Exchange signifying "finished," when you will be immediately disconnected.

#### SPECIAL NOTE.

Your BELL is only to be used for TWO purposes : namely—  
TO RING UP EXCHANGE

OR

TO RING OFF WHEN FINISHED.

To use it other than above will only be productive of delay and annoyance.

#### HINTS TO SUBSCRIBERS.

1. HAVE the NUMBER and NAME of the Subscriber you want READY before you call the Exchange.

2. GIVE the NUMBER and NAME IMMEDIATELY you are answered, and do not ask the operators any questions outside their business ; if you delay them with questions, they cannot attend to their work ; confine yourself strictly to the number and name of the Subscriber you want.

3. When connected, DO NOT AGAIN USE YOUR BELL (except to ring off) ; should you do so, you will be immediately disconnected. if you leave your Telephone to seek information, ask the other end to WAIT and LISTEN ; on return *speaking direct* ; DO NOT RING, or you will be disconnected. To prevent others ringing in your absence, hang a conspicuous notice on instrument—"Telephone Engaged"—till your return.

4. Only ring off when FINISHED with a Subscriber ; do not delay, you may be wanted by some one else. The operation of RINGING when FINISHED causes a SPECIAL SHUTTER to FALL ; this is the ONLY MEANS the operators have of knowing when you have finished.

5. Speak into your Transmitter in a CLEAR EVEN TONE ; unless you do this you will not be understood properly. If you talk in an imperfect or in an unintelligible way, the Transmitter will do the same.

6. See that you ALWAYS HANG YOUR RECEIVING TELEPHONE on the SWITCH OF THE CALL BOX ; this must be done or you cannot be rung up. This closes your Bell circuit and so enables you to be rung up.

7. For talking, the Switch is opened by the action of taking off the Receiver. SHOULD YOU leave it CONTINUALLY OPEN by forgetting to replace your Receiver, your Battery will run down, and your TELEPHONE WILL BE USELESS, in which case you must not blame your Telephone.

8. The Postmaster-General, while undertaking to provide at all times communication between Subscribers, will not be held responsible for any interruption that may arise at any time over which he has no control.

9. Unless Subscribers pay strict attention to the Rules the Exchange cannot be satisfactorily worked.

10. Answer promptly when rung up. Attendance of Subscribers cannot be insured, nor can Subscribers be compelled to answer if present when rung up ; but with mutual consideration shown by Subscribers to one another in this respect, the business between them will be greatly facilitated.

11. A Telephone Exchange is worked on the mutual principle ; and, as each Subscriber expects a prompt reply, it behoves each to give prompt attention when called.

12. Every endeavour will be made to insure prompt attention at the Exchanges ; but, when once a Subscriber is connected with the number he requires, the Exchange cannot be responsible for any subsequent delay in obtaining a reply, as the matter then rests with the other Subscriber.

#### TELEPHONE BUREAUX, &c.

Telephone Bureaux have been established for use of the public by which a person can speak to any subscriber during office hours on payment of Sixpence for each five minutes or fraction if within a radius of six miles. Beyond that distance the charge will be One Shilling for each five minutes or fraction. Communication between Subscribers and persons at the Exchange or Bureaux will as a rule be limited to five minutes at any one time.

Bureaux, in accordance with the above, have been opened for the use of the public at the under-mentioned Offices ; viz. :—Hobart, Sandy Bay (Lower), Sandy Bay, Kingston, Bismarck, Glenlusk, Glenorchy, Moonah, New Town, North, South, and West Hobart, Bellerive, Fern Tree, Springs, and New Norfolk ; also at Launceston, Invermay, Windmill Hill, and Wellington Road.
